15th thrashing came for the cattle left 13
Dollars 20th a Dugout came in my head almost
falling down when it takes me thrashing
21st at Hamilton thrashing 22nd thrashing 23rd
Virginia Birth Day 18th having garden came
down from Hamilton with me apples
a Bag and Basket 24th our Kings Birth Day
taking in 14 Bushels had in a Box and 15 there
in a heap covered of Potatoes that's over 100
Bushels in the cellar now I saw some
wood 25th My Birth Day cut a theory fire
on some due to 26th Wicks fallen here one
of the men is the Labor Inspector in Montreal
Mr Boyer had St James
Boat gave me 35 cents to send it home I treated
me to some old Kye 27th Windy made some cheese
fixing a Box for ashes to hold the Traveller sent
By the Passport 28th end part with St James
Boat Randolph and I bought of J Sumner
10 yds of Cotton 10 yds of Linsey 2 yds of Calico Tea
2 Bars of Soap R R R Pomelo shot Sugar
Matches a Box pipe 3 pens Bought of Mr Ward
1/2 Bushel of coarse salt peck Fine salt 3 lb of lime
1 lb Tea 1 lb and 2 links need for sulphur nails 7 lb
of Sugar pipe Butter Dub gave 4 Dollars to
Mr Ward to be put to my account
East Wind Stopt at Hamilton
all night 29th Raining came home Randolph
and Mr Hamilton came of the Boat
from Montreal got a 10 lb of Flour
from Tom got some apples Crabs for
the Row no less worth bad with Diphtheria

Got Boat on the Water from Tom a Fine Day
West Wind Mr Lambert here Stopt all night 31st
Holy Eve Fine Lambert went of taking home
wood Leander found a Cushion in the Box
Keeping Holy Eve Cracking nuts till late
Randolph Swinia Leander Fernandez John Ho
Rowena and Stanley all at nuts Beech
Butternut Bitter & Sweet Pigory Co Kaul Flayael
1st of November The Harvest Month
of Death All Saints Day Randolph crossed
to Hamilton came with the Row for
the Hoifers Gordon Tommy Jack Randolph
and Alexander Rose East Wind all
souls Day Got the Boat to Goto Lancaster
3rd Randolph and I to Lancaster 11 lb of
our weight in Lancaster 9 lb paid 11.5 cents
Very windy Rained ^{Bought of Cong Bread 12 cents} some till wet
4th cleaning up stairs Randolph crossed with
J Hamiltons Boat went down with
Tom to Beans & Mashers about a Holy
Eve scrape beyond Gate plastering
the stable Gordon left Hamilton salted
11 Dozen and a Half of 29 g Shells
2 Bushel of Corn 5th My Sankes
Day Banking & end of the House
Mr Burdo here Phillip brought
me an Overshirt from Montreal 11.25
put some ^{under} manure around the Apple
trees on the Lower Point & rose
hard last night & fine wind changed
to East almost in snow the Rain that
fell 6th Henry Bosell & Burdo here got Milk
James W & I got all and the 2 girls Jane and Annie
and the 2 Boys Alex Peter and Donald John Toming
Rose and Alexander Rose in the Bush at nuts
Fine Rained some West Wind
