7 Sabbath, fine day, a large congregation

 3 tons, cut since Thursday  
 the heavy rain of Friday after  
 noon kept them from getting  
 that in. Bertie scalded her  
 foot two weeks ago, and is  
 yet hopping on one foot  
 Her was home yesterday  
 Aunt Mary was here yes  
 today. Merton was four days  
 at D.R. M.L. last week  
 Mary D.R. leaves for Toronto  
 today to visit - Dr. Hunt  
 Merton got a nice pair of boots  
 from Jennie M.L.

23 Rain this morning. We got the money for the  
 hay yesterday \$120.00. Our folk went this  
 afternoon to hay have down a good deal  
 I baked in oven.

24 I did not go to prayer meeting bought at  
 John A's 3 lbs dices apples 25, 1 lb cheese 12<sup>cts</sup> = 1.60

26 We got in all the hay on the Curwinn place  
 it was dark when the men came home  
 I bought at Willis' 10 yds gray cotton 1.00

 print 4 1/2 yds = 35. 2 yds dark print = 15 = 50  
 1 spool thread 5. 2 Kachuffs 10 = 2 yds white 13 45
