- May 1st. Rec 25 top-grafted Spy trees from Stone & Wellington Nurseries at fifty cents each.
- 2nd. Went to St. George in the forenoon to get a box of evergreen and fruit trees from Smith's Nurseries, Winona and finished sowing mixed grain (Alaska oats & Barley) about 2 acres in back 140 acre field. Nellie had a little heifer calf. Fashen was here.
- 3rd. Solby Moon came up from Brantford in the evening to stay over Sunday on a little visit. He and I went to Franklins for dinner.
- 4th. Mrs. Mrs. Buchanan of Galt came down and had tea with us.
- 5th. Bert Williamson came to help plant trees in young orchard.
- 6th. Went to Mr. McCormick's for 2 evergreens & to Sheriff's office. Planted 25 Evergreens along the road at end of young orchard, a very heavy rain in the evening & at night.
- 7th. Planted 25 h. Spy's, 10 Mc. Intosh Red, 5 Snow & 2 greenings & 4 pines in young orchard.
- 8th. Went to Mrs. Atkins Funeral in the afternoon.
- 9th. Sowed 3 acres of barley in 3 acre field at north of lane.
- 10th. Sowed clover seed on 3 acre field and harrowed it.
- 11th. H. Boake & I went to Mr. Farguharson's in the evening to arrange programme for Township Convention.
- 12th. Red cow had seven little pigs.
- 13th. A very wet day, started to draw manure to the garden.
- 14th. Transplanted early tomato plants to cold-frame (72) and planted first gladiolus bulbs at south of house.
- 15th. Plowed the garden in the afternoon and planted early potatoes (3 rows) north of the house.
- 16th. Finished sowing oats & mixed grain on the hill north of the house.
