we arrived at Guelph at
1.30 A.M. I got to bed
about 4 A.M. & at 7
A.M. had to get stock
ready to go to the show
we showed cattle in afternoon
got 1st & 2nd on Calf. 3rd on
Yearling. 2nd & 3rd on 2 wo
year old and 3rd on cow
2nd on Carcase of Steer
