24 Fine day. For Robertson called Jimmie had two of D. M. Robertson men for the afternoon, bowed 12 bush of oats 70 bread 24

25 Began to rain last evening and rained all night, I will have my dress done for church, after a fashion. Marion is making the wrist

26 My skirt and wrist are finished. Mrs Ellis paid \$5.00 for two months rent. 3 lbs steak at Sanday's Paid 95 to Campbells for one weeks milk, and paid 15 to them for milk for three morning

27 I went to church. This was our communion day. Rev. G. McCallum of Toronto conducted it. Collectors for F. Association and August 1st Our off. 2.00

28 Cold day I sowed a few seeds Mangels and beets Mrs Ridgway paid 3.00 for one month

29 Cold again. Sowed carrots and parsnips. finished garden except a few potatoes I will put in tomorrow J. C. had W. Matheson to wear one about Pas with Billie Robertson N. W. here all day. it was Court of Revision day 70 2 1/4 lb Bacon 36.00 2 loaves 10.00 70 a tramp yesterday 10.00

30 Fine but cold. Planted long 19 potatoes Mrs G. Elder called in evening Jimmie finished on field

31 Fine bright day. Marion sowing herbs. Lillie 80 Pot at Willis. 2 lbs Tapioca 10 Shell 10 Corn starch 10 Macaroni 15 Codfish 47. Chicken ham 72 tongue 10. 1 lbs prunes 10 70 3 lbs butter from factory 75. paid 100 for last week butter. Mrs J. S. Brown and two children spent the day with us

June 1906

1 Friday. Heavy rain in morning fine & windy in the afternoon. Gave Jimmie money to pay for butter got at Willis Murdy, at North Lancaster

2 Fine warm day 70 pm bread 20. 1 lb tea 25.00

3 When we were at breakfast - an English migrant came with a card from W. McNaughtan C. C. at Three Rivers. And Jimmie has taken him for a while 70 my church off 10.00

4 Fine hot day. Murdy took the potato vegetables out of the cellar I sent a letter to D. B. M. L. Cornwall asking for money and I wrote to J. S. McArthur Lancaster Lizzie called with a gem of cream. 1 lb tea 30 yall coal oil 20

5 Fine day. The will probate came today

6 Heavy rain all morning. Ellen Pellinier washing 25 for 1/2 day. 10.00 for washing dishes

7 The day of Pas funeral. 70 2 loaves 10 sugar 25

8 Mrs Thomas paid \$4.00 for rent (3 lbs butter on Tuesday) Brock cutting wood here

9 Fine day. Put Paris Green on currant bushes. Mr & Mrs. John Christie and Isabel spent the yesterday with us. The day was wet and they wanted fire so they made a fire - Marion put out cabbage and tomato plants that Jimmie got from Pilly Jim Murdy 2 cans salmon

10 A heavy storm of thunder lightning and rain last night began about midnight - and heavy all day. When Jimmie went to the farm, he found the Englishman gone he left a note on the door saying he would see him again 70 bread 20 2 pineapples 25

11 Very fine day high wind. There was another storm last night 70 3 lbs hard 45 molasses 15 70 lb pepper 10. 7 lb stew 35 Paid walls milk 35
