I went down with team in sleigh took oats down exchanged for oat meal at Armstrongs⁶⁸ brought up bag flour got 2 hay tickets and one man sold at scales³⁰ dt went into Armstrongs paid for cutter^{\$2.15} calf^{\$8.50} ground stone & apple press³⁵ 5% off cash \$29.00 and brought them up. In P.M. Jack Black helped us kill white steer (see 3rd) and skin it I took down skin sold it to Keman for \$1.50 received from Dr Groves cheque for \$23.00 forster paid Beattie & Co for rope for sheep 6.58 got disinfected from Fred Armstrong for stall.
