my last call for money to the

Wed Dec 31st clear a pleasant winters day
this being the last day of 1902
many changes have taken place
within the year, what may take
place in the year to come we
know not

Thu Jan 1st 1903

clear and pleasant. I went over
to Brother John Snarys and
sent New years day.

Fri Dec Jan 2nd cloudy and soft. Sprinkle
of rain this after noon. Sarah was
here baking and cleaning up.

Broton January 1903

Sat Jan 3rd cloudy and soft, rain
last night the snow going away
fast. I went down to Lashbrook

Sun Jan 4th cloudy and soft some snow

Mon Jan 5th cloudy and moderate snow fore
part of the day. I went to the pole and
voted this fore noon. George Thompson
that been living at Widow Hustons
died with the Typhoid fever was
buried this after noon.

Tue Jan 6th clear fore part of the day and cold
Mr Newcomb was there part of the fore
noon

Wed Jan 7th about three inches of snow fell
last night and snowing most of
to day. Dick took me to Presden this
after noon to see the sugar factory
the sight was as good as a Fair

Thu Jan 8th clear part of the day and
cold. William Hopper from Kansas
call'd to see me this after noon. I
didnt know him at first until
he told me who he was.
