- 11 (Sunday) B. & Mary to Lily. Stormy, but no sleighing
- 12 Stormy all day. Pating away. Implements. A to Fugas with Cutler
- 13 Hastings Threshing. Stormy Draining wood
- 14 " " 2 hands. sold 5 Cattle to Geo. Buur @ 32
- 15 Took over 5 Cattle to Fugas wt 4880
- 16 to Fugas with Chop. 7 Bags took straw to G. Klime
- 17 to Guelph with Cutler Poor sleighing. Cold & Fine Above
- 18 to Fugas. County Council nomination. Snowing. 10 Below
- 20 for Smeltzer's sale. heavy snowfall. good sleighing cold
- 21 B. & go to Belwood. Got Rubbers. To A. Hannas at night. C. Knitner call
- 22 Miller Draining up Hay. A to Fugas. Killing Pigs at Romm's and L 40
- 23 Thaw sleighing gone. Working at Building. Cold (Felted) No limits
- 24 B. to Fugas with Chop. Cold. B. & Mary down at night
- 25 (Sunday) B. and A. to Church. Stamp on the Car
- 26 Raw misty Byron struck by the train on N^W line crossing and had his Leg Broken Badly. Removed to the Alexandria Hospital where it was amputated above the knee that night and he seemed to be doing well. A stayed all night
- 27 Rain which of course it fell making very slippery roads went to Hospital when he seemed still well. Came home in afternoon but was called back at night he being worse
- 28 Byron died in the Hospital this morning at 1 o'clock stayed in Hospital all night. And was buried in the morning by Geo. Russell. go Thompson Beat the Procty of 1st night Cold Stormy and Roads very icy
- 29 the most dangerous Roads I ever saw still cold with snow
- 30 Still Raw. cold and sleighy Byrons companions Bro. Wealth : Gates Ajar
- 31 Miller Byrons Funeral Large attendance Considering the roads since at the House & Belzede Cemetery by J. B. Mullan All Neighbors have been very helpful and sympathetic but the sudden Beavermut is hard
