- 15 I made a large washing, waited two weeks for a woman and could not get one
- 16 Very warm I was told that yesterday the mercury was up to 92, and today away over 80 Jimmie is kept busy giving out volunteer supplies
- 17 Marion and Clara Kennedy went to the front to clean a cottage which Daisy rented on Home Island To 8 loaves 48, passage 25, Jimmie is busy fixing for to leave on Monday
- 18 Not very many in church, Mercury higher still.
- 19 Jimmie left about 7.30 a.m. Marion in the evening, hoed in garden
- 20 I washed today, white clothes, one blanket Mrs Robertson and Helen & Mrs Stewart called
- 21 Fire came in morning, Murchy got wheat 60 granules, Orany meat, and a little rooled wheat 30 To beef 30
- 22 Fine day.
- 23 Another fine day. Pa. has Lewis Corrier and Dick Stott fixing wire fence on the 2d Con. firm Had Oliver Collett weeding carrots. To 8 loaves 48 The red cow had a bull calf this morning.
- 24 McErinnon drove Pa. to see Stott & Corrier at the fence To 3 lbs steak 30, sugar 50, Pa. M. Colette \$1.50 for hay and half at roots & potatoes 1.50
- 25 Daniel Scott preached, Bertha and Babe, came to stay for 2 weeks.
- 26 Pa. Mrs Craig of Glen Walter brought her daughter to remain during the entrance
- 28 To 2 cans salmon 35 beef at Sandy McFadyr 50 Eppy Grant there for exam Turn to page 2 & 6

July 1904

- 1 Saturday. Mellinore ploughed our pot stoves. 60 cts
- 2 John McLeenan Leannessie came this morning to F. Robertson's, just from Scotland
- 3 Mrs Robertson and Leannessie called at 9 P.M.
- 4 Jimmie & Marion went to the S. School Pic Nic at Hamiltons Island, To sugar 25, cream tartar pan bread 24, D. M. Kinnaman left for Mon treal
- 5 Very hot - To sausage 30
- 6 Birdie and Marion busy sewing, Very hot
- 7 Very hot. The children very restless
- 8 To 4 loaves 24, steak 40
- 9 Birdie and baby went home, John Robertson N. March took tea with us, Jimmie went yesterday, to Dunvegan and took Leannessie
- 10 Marion washed, To bread 24
- 11 Hot, Hot. We pulled some red currants, Jimmie took our calf to Lancaster sold it to M. Greger, for 3.50. To 2 bags wheat granules 60 rooled wheat 25, Give for, To 1 lb green tea 60 42 lb black 20, 5 yds chess cloth 25, 3 1/4 yds 45, mosquito net 26 cts, 32 lbs sugar 22.50
- 12 Pa is 85 today, It is hot, 90 in the shade
- 13 Had Ann Hall washing 4 hours 35. To pan bread 59
- 14 Murchy went away yesterday to attend a court to deal at Alexandria. Made 6 lbs red currant jam Baked 16 lbs red currant jam on 12th Birdie came for some currants, Mrs Mc Martin (one Ann McLeenan) was buried here today
- 15 To 4 lb sausage tick, Pan bread me 24
- 16 A pretty good congregation
- 17 Rained last night. I pulled the rest of the red currants, Murchy left for some where
