Will and I went down to Thurlow's place this morning after some sheep. He brought home 14 which I paid three dollars and a half for. This increases our flock to about forty ewes.

We all worked at getting in Cloverseed this afternoon. Got in three loads. This did not take it all but there are about three loads left. Our grind C. H. from Dover came to night.

I have enjoyed a goodly portion of the love of God in my heart to day. Praise the Lord for his abundant mercy.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 18, 1870.

Will went away this morning to attend the show at Simcoe. Charles & I went this afternoon. We had quite a pleasant sojourn. I did see Ed. Carpenter who has just returned from the West. Also several others whom I had wished to see for some time. The show, taken all together, was very good, especially the sheep and horses which departments were first class. The horses so were good. But the cattle I would pronounce somewhat inferior.
