I fell on the kitchen floor today and I am so sore that I can hardly stir. I got 5 eggs today.
 31. At noon Mercury was up to 54. Jimmie left in evening for Montreal. Murdy went by Moccasin for Hals. Katie & Kristie came to stay with me. This has been a very fine month very little snow. Wheels are what are used altogether. Our hens are scratching in the garden.
