

Wm. D. Cameron Jan 25<sup>th</sup> of Nov 1881

Banking in the cook house Cold & misty turned fine  
in the evening wind changed to South E. then changed  
to South West the Boats to Day lights all up  
Feeding the cattle putting them in cutting stone  
26<sup>th</sup> high South West Wind a fog went down with a  
Breeze snowed a little not cold snow melting  
some drops of Rain. Drying Dray seen a  
Munk track at the foot of the Island set  
4 traps to night for him I suppose the  
burning of the marshes on both sides  
Drove him here Ducks not plenty seen  
a flock of Wild Geese yesterday warm  
marshes burning on the south side well

27<sup>th</sup> snow and Rain 28<sup>th</sup> cutting wood  
29<sup>th</sup> high Wind 30<sup>th</sup> St Michael's Day

The 4<sup>th</sup> of the 10<sup>th</sup> of the Scotch Young  
some shots Killed 2 Roosters Drove  
some wood a fine day 1<sup>st</sup> of December

Went to Summer town Bought of Mr  
Ward 2 Bushels salt 25 8 lbs of Pork 1. 2 1/2 Pms 8  
Dax 1 cent 1/2 lb Tea 25 Soap 8 3 lbs nails 12 Bought  
of Summers Tea 25 Broom 25 Blue  
nutmegs 3 shools 10 Raining high Wind

Stopt at Hamletons all night  
a light on cherry Island to night

2<sup>nd</sup> came home got 5 olog Flour  
22 lb of Pork 1 Bushel of Pease

Heard James Hugh came home  
Heard James Mac Duans daughter Dred

3 got a Munk fine snowing Raining  
4<sup>th</sup> Gordon here Brought my  
Short Gun home he is thrashing

with Charle Parisha Brought a Dred  
from Bismarck to Sessy

W. Mass Common Island 5<sup>th</sup> Dec 1881  
Windy Drawing Wood picking old water fine  
6<sup>th</sup> The Festival of the Germans St Nicholas  
Fixing the step of the Door Fining around  
the Sheds high Wind calm Rain Randolph  
not well Rowena not well cattle pick-  
ing out in the Daytime 7<sup>th</sup> Raining & Wind  
changed to West Randolph and to Lancaster for  
the year till 24<sup>th</sup> Wind paid .5 cents paid when I left  
the wool Went to Mr Dunlops took Dinner Randolph  
and I Bought of Mr M<sup>r</sup> Crummon 1 pair of Boots for  
Rowena 1.10 Bought a Pair for myself 3.10 cents  
came up along shore as the Wind is high as far as  
H. Washers Point then cut across and we had  
a hard time crossing as the Wind was very high  
Left the Canoe at the Lower Point as the  
Wind is high to take it would be to the Door  
all wet. Moved to night 8<sup>th</sup> cold Blowing  
Feeding Cattle cutting Stone Wood 9<sup>th</sup> A Fine  
Day thawing Windy Drawing Drags a sail Down at  
the Pit Pit 10<sup>th</sup> Leanders Birth Day 1872 Fine Day  
Drawing Drags 11<sup>th</sup> Sunday cold and Fine 12<sup>th</sup> Went  
to Hobblest worths got the store and 4 Bushels of  
Wheat Drove it Down to J. Hamiltors for  
me in the Waggon Bought of Mr Ward 1 lb  
Yea 30<sup>th</sup> Fare 2 cents Brought 3 Rats to John  
Hamilton John & Tom Pack to Lancaster  
with a Load of Buckwheat Roads Bought  
Left my wheat at Hamiltors till they  
would be going to mill Beg wind to night  
13<sup>th</sup> went for the stove to Hamiltors  
got Johns Boat Raining took a  
Drake to Hamiltors took the Boat  
out of the Boat house for me put out the  
Double stove put up the cooking stove  
to night had a Bottle of wine  
14<sup>th</sup> Raining Wind Choppin Stone Wood
