- 25 Bright day, like soap day. Birdie and the children came to stay a few days  
To pan bread 20 Jinnie got ton and half from G. Brown
- 26 Bright, but cold. The Cubes not too well  
Charlotte M. Gill's <sup>daughter</sup> with us. Poured rain all
- 28 Dan Mc Donald, who died in Toronto, in June was buried here today. Mrs Kennedy and Clara were in for a while in the evening  
May called in afternoon. Tassie at night
- 29 The Cubes are not very well. Rain in afternoon. D. Saddlers <sup>was</sup> in all afternoon
- 30 To 2 pans bread 40. 2 lbs suet 35. molasses 15. 2 lb lard 30 1.20  
1 gull coal oil 20. Bellinus stable shed <sup>was</sup> ~~burned~~ <sup>burned</sup> in afternoon. The people had to work hard to save the house. Dingwall's little house on the other street caught fire but the roof was well watered. It escaped

Murdy came in evening, and went back, he said he forgot some papers
- 3 Rain today. Jinnie tapped a few trees at home
- 4 I sat the loach.
- 5 Fine day. no frost last night - Murdy not back
- 6 Fine day. Lizzie Brown called her baby is three weeks old. made about a cup full of syrup
- 7 Murdy got home about 7.30. To 5 loaves 25. Ball 10 35  
I boiled a pot of soup
- 8 Fine day.
- 9 I was in church, we had a good sermon
- 10 Dull day, had Ann half yr day, parting 25 25  
Uplong, long snow and wash. He are 44 years in the spoke
- 11 Kind of dull. Moun Kivivis is in terrific capture, on the 10<sup>th</sup> the people in all the neighbouring villages had to clear for their lives To red dress 25
- 12 Drizzle of rain Kemp was here and tuned the piano
- 13 Pa got a cheque from Mrs Doel for \$11.00. interest on a mortgage. Jinnie was away all day looking for pike. got a fine big fellow
- 14 Yesterday, Kivivis took another direction for her lava and two towns, one N. E. the other N. West were pretty well demolished  
Magachy brought 30 lbs maple sugar 10 from us  
20 for Uncle Sandy. and 5 gall of syrup for us. It began to rain about 5  
Had a letter from Marion. Sold the eggs 4 doz 5. To 1 lb tea 25. I've two day to a widow Bellinus put up a little stable between the house and the village this week
