I took dinner at Far. Down's and met Mrs Andrew M Leman of Ottawa. Christy Down drove me to Donald Roy's to see his younger son Fargher who is near the end of his journey. he has not been conscious of any thing since Wednesday. The English name of his disease is consumption of the brain. since Monday he has been paralyzed since Tuesday. I rode home with Mr M Cullaway
- 8 Fine day. a great number in church. Far. M Leman died last night will be buried tomorrow. Mrs Dugald formerly of Williamstown. at the time of her death living at Maxville, will be buried tomorrow
- 9 Not much done by us. The two funerals took place Duncan Mason & daughter took tea with us
10. a great appearance of fire
11. who at prayer meeting boys finished the hay.
12. a great circus at Cornwall today. I made a number of visits, sick calls, first to see Ruben Burton who had cholera. he is some better. then to Mrs M Rae & Mrs M Leman. both better today then to see William's baby who is dying of diphtheria 5 months old. then to see Anne; and on my home got 2 lbs tea at Davis and had it changed
