- 16 Not many in church a very good sermon. prayer in St. Church
- 17 Washed today and it was very cold
- 18 Tuesday S. S. Convention meets in Cornwall today. Mr Gilling Mrs Mc Lennan. Elder & Inder are all from Woburn Mrs Grant & Mrs Dan. think of going in the afternoon I bought at Willis and had it charged  $1\frac{3}{4}$  yds cloth 2.75 per yd,  $1\frac{3}{4}$  furrows satin <sup>40</sup> yds wadding 2 spools B. thread 1 yd worst <sup>5</sup> spool silk 5cts 1 yd cotton 9.  $\frac{1}{2}$  cotton 7  $\frac{1}{4}$  ulacia 20. 1 Luby 45  $\frac{3}{4}$  cotton 4cts
- got charged at Davis  $1\frac{3}{4}$  yds slave lining 1 lb starch
- 19 There has been a big flood at Cornwall, beginning in the early morning. the mills & factories are all flooded a lot of cattle drowned, one man drowned Brewster. he was brought up in Martintown
- 20 701 packet of envelopes 5cts sent a letter to you, I heard that a woman died in Cornwall from exposure in the flood
- 21 Mrs Dan Mrs Murre were here telling me that there is to be a feast for the G. School scholars, on Tuesday and I am expected to prepare something
- 22 Rained some this evening boys took home a load of straw Watson's concert last night was very good. and there was a fine purse. P. S. 50. R. R. 25 D. M. M. 25
