Tues 14 Had Ann washing some things of Murdoch's shirts and trousers gave her 60<sup>cts</sup> Dan Christie here to dinner. He was a week in Toronto now 9 P. M. feels like frost

Wed 15 Fine day. Jimmie got home at 5 P. M. At 7 1/2 whole wheat flour 48<sup>cts</sup> 2 loaves 22

Thurs 16 Bright but cold, I transplanted wallflowers 1 gall coal oil 25

Frid 17 2 loaves 22

Sat 18 Milk 56, 4 loaves 44

Sun 19 Fine day a large congregation @ Fund 25-

Mon 20 Ann 50, 4 eggs. Boys planting potatoes and beans and corn a shower came on have the Italian working 1/2 day Took off the storm windows, mosquitoes out in myriads

Tues 21 Fine day. holiday in H School, The Inspector of the Cadet corps is inspecting the boys. Bread 4-42

Wed 22 Planted beans and corn in the garden and Parsnips and carrots. A little rain

Thurs 23 Planted peas and radish 2 loaves 1 gall coal oil 25. Rooled oats 35 Agnes went home in evening

Frid 24 Fine day quite cool sowed cucumbers

Sat 25 Milk from Majors for last time to take from Stearts. To night 57. Bread 44

Sun 26 General fund 25

Mon 27 Heavy rain, lightning, thunder this a.m. 1 to 2:30 Mrs Christie and Bella came about 8:30. a.m. Mrs Christie brought and planted Cabbage, tomatoes, Asters, finks box lies bleeding wall flowers
