Jan^y 6th
Settled with Tho^s McKinsey before M^r Busch
to have wheat for 3 dollars about 3 bushels &
16¢ more if clam. Cox refuses to take his oath that
I employ'd J. E. to clear land

Jan^y 7th
Employ'd by M^r Tice to settle her affairs

13th
M^r Tice to pay me 32¢ in Corn as^d agreement with her,

Jan^y 21st
Paid John Darling for Laying my 1st Bush Wheat
22^d

Received from M^r Tice 2 Bushels Corn on acct.
Agreed with Dav^d Beestodes & M^r Tice to Teach David
every Saturday Evening & Sunday morning for which they
are to allow me 1/2 a bushel of Corn every time I
come

27th Jan^y
Went there on Saturday for the first time David
gone to the Grand River
Went again on Saturday 28th Jan^y not at home
29th Jan^y

Recd^d Leather for a pair shoes from M^r Canby
Feb^y 4th

Recd^d from my father-in-law a young black
Sow.

Friday Feb^y 13th
Went to M^r Tices to teach David

February 9th 1792

My young black Sow pig'd 6 Pigs

Saturday 11th Feb^y

Went to Niagara on M^r Tices Business

8th Feb^y

Threshed for Elijah Collard towards making a pair shoes
14th d^y - - - - - 15th Feb^y

The Bell Cow Calved a Heifer
20th Feb^y

Gave my Note to Solomon Flyet for 8 Bush^{ls}
Buck Wheat £2..8..0. - N.Y.C

27th Feb^y

A Pair shoes made by Elijah Collard
Paid by Threshing 2 days
March 1st

Received a young Ram Lamb from Peter Secord Sen^r
2^d March (small Dead)

The white-faced Cow calved a Bull
8th March (named Lenox)

Received from Peter Secord Sen^r 1 Bushel of
Buck Wheat & 1 Bushel of Wheat & 1 Bushel Rye
31st March

Bought a Bull Calf of M^r Deighton
calved 15th to pay 12¢ (named Hunter)
3^d April

Took up my Appell Trees and planted out
57 in the field which was raised from seed which
I sowed six years before, which makes in all set out
