

Saturday, January 17

- July 31st. Drove Jean and the little folks to Paris in the morning and put Mr. Johnson's oats in the afternoon.
- Aug 1st. Drove in mixed grain from 14 acre field, Alaska oats and No. 21 Barley, a fine crop and ripened well together.
- Mr. Schuetter brought Mr. McRae to judge the field of No. 22 Oats in 10 acre field, which I had entered in the Standing field crop competition.
- Aug 2nd. A very nice rain in the morning and also in the afternoon. Went to Uncle Andrew Sharps in the evening for tea.
- 4th. Finished cutting No. 22 Oats in back 10 acre field, a very heavy crop, but owing to the Army mow a lot of it was straggled down and shelled.
5. Finished drawing in mixed grain 9 loads and 1/2 of Alaska oats.
- 6th. Helped Simon to thresh and Matt. helped Franklins to press hay. Helped Johnson to thresh in afternoon.
- Received word from Toronto that I had taken 2nd Prize in the field (Standing) competition for Brant Co. with No. 22 Oats.
8. Threshed 2 day 10 bus. P.A.C. Oats, 47 of Alaska Oats and 290 of mixed grain, it running about 40 bus. per acre, also 75 bush wheat.
- Drove Jean and the children to the station in the afternoon.
10. A very fine rain in the morning and also one in the evening. Cultivated turnips in the morning and helped Bob Atkin to thresh in the afternoon.
12. Finished cutting oats and put the binder away for the season.
