Postural Drainage.—In acute abdominal conditions we believe that postural drainage plays a very important part in the recovery of the patient. For example: In cases of perforated appendix, with peritonitis, if the patient be kept well up in bed and lying to the extreme right side, he has a much better chance of recovery than if this principle is not followed. To render drainage efficient in these cases, frequent changes of the wet dressing are advisable.—Balfour; Mayo Clinic. Med. Record.

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
