Pleurisy in Children—No. 1.

The clinical course of the non-tuberculous pleurisy may be initiated by symptoms of pneumonia (pneumonia is almost invariably present even though the symptoms may not be suggestive), in which case failure upon the part of the child to recover is usually attributed to an unresolved pneumonia, a diagnosis which, in my experience, is almost invariably open to question. Symptoms persisting after the date of crisis should lead the physician to suspect pleural exudate.—*Williams; Med. World.*
