- 27 Had Prue with a team 1/2 day, and W. Lenoque 1 day. To beef 50 cts. Not counting Prue or Lenoquette our hay labor and provisions cost 11.30. provision they took to the field. #1. = 10.30 for labor 11.30
- 28 Rain. A very small congregation Magge Falkner (Mrs Rogers), sang in quire, and gave The Holy City for a voluntary. And it was very fine
- 29 Girls are busy. Marion expects. Agnes Jamison of Pulley field to make her a visit
- 30 Pa is thinking of going to the Springs
- 31 Pa left for the Springs. McCormick went too. They went by rail. To vanilla 15. raisins 10. Paid 50 cts to Bechtel for Saturday's beef and 20 today. To 1/2 lb coffee 20. corn 15. Mrs Rodwell all day 50. 10 cts not accounted for

August 1901

- 29 Thursday fine day
- 30 Had a post card from Marion from Ogdensburg. Began to rain
- 31 Rain pouring. To beef 30. The boys went this fore noon to Alexandria to a L. Conservative convention. P. M. boys got home. McLevit (Cherish man from Lochiel) chosen for to represent the Con. in the Local House. Dan Angus Grant. S. A. was buried today aged 86



August 1901

- 1 Thursday. To molasses 15. currants 10 25
- 2 cans salmon 30. 1 gall. lard oil 20 50
- brown sugar 25. honey 30. 55
- Brodie and I went to Womans meeting at Jessie McKenzies. Our offer 50 50
- Miss Jamison came about 7. Jimmie went to Lancaster to meet her at the boat
- 2 Fine day cool. Girls went to drive
- 3 To beef 45 45
- 4 A pretty large congregation. Mr Burnett preached
- 5 Pa came home today. To 1 lb tea 25. 25
- sugar 25. John McCormick of Chicago and his mother took tea with us. She remained with us all night. He stayed at Sullivan's. Our young folk went to spend the fore night at Prunings
- 6 Girls but they expect company tonight
- 7 Prunings. But John & Tassie Dingwall and Miss Gibbons spent the evening with us
- 8 Rain thunder & lightning. Jimmie went to the excursion of the Forresters to Montreal. I was at the vestry in afternoon helping quilt. To 2 bunches butter 16 16
- 3 yds flannel 21. gave it to the quilt 21
- 9 Our young folk went in afternoon to the front for a little picnic. Paid Marion 35 35
- Began to rain about 4 P. M. I went to the vestry to help finish the quilt. Mrs. McCormick & Mrs. Castanack were there
- 10 It was half past 1. A. M. when our folk got home. They were at Mr Matheson's social. It poured rain all night and has rained all day. 3 P. M. still
