G. sowed corn & harrowed.

E & I cut 4 ft wood & waf. wood & logs in
chopping.

Staved all corn sowed by stirring it with stick
dipped in tar. A better way would be to pour hot water
on corn to cover, then put 2 teaspoons of tar on top, and
if pot has small holes in bottom, by time water is all out, the
corn will be quite coated.
