 very Stormy Day Wind Drafting Snowing and Blowing  
 22<sup>nd</sup> Ash Wednesday Washingtons Berth a very  
 Stormy Wind 23<sup>rd</sup> a very Fine Day Drawing  
 Wood Began to feed all the cattle find  
 hay keeping in the White Bull Cropped  
 over to Antvime Rosells to see how the  
 ice was heard Jim Mc Dougall lost his  
 sleigh and cow Bars and things that was  
 on his sleigh when his horses got in  
 the road Steward Deed and was spending  
 a great deal of Cropping on the upper  
 and Lower Roads to Day 24<sup>th</sup> a very Fine Day  
 Hughlam Went to Mrs Peter Chisholms the 3<sup>rd</sup> one  
 and I went to William <sup>a 13<sup>th</sup> child of 2</sup> <sup>Angus Mc Lellan</sup> 25<sup>th</sup> Fine  
 Buried to Day a very Large Funeral Went to Buxton  
 a very Fine Day came home called at Mrs Chisholm  
 in the fore to see Bismarck and Hughlam  
 took Dinner there got a Ride from Sawlogs and

Mr James Cameron Jan 27<sup>th</sup>  
very fine warm Day put a ton of Marsh hay in  
the Barn the east of the stack Drew some  
wood cut some Cedars on the north side of  
the Island for Nails cutting stove wood seen  
some grass Birds a good deal of cropping on the  
East and West Road not very well freezing tonight  
Thomas Munroe Departed 28<sup>th</sup> crossed  
to Hamilton went up to night to the Wake  
stopt all night Randolph to Mr Ward salt  
15 cents Darning needle. Solomon Falkner  
wanting a place to fish did not let  
him have it 1<sup>st</sup> of March came in very  
Windy and Wet fall Day Thomas Munroe  
Departed went up to Nicholsons John Hamilton  
and I Rain ceased and we came to Hamilton  
Gordon and Tom across the River Gordon  
went out with Charlie Parisha to  
hunt 2<sup>nd</sup> fine came from Hamilton  
Ducks Plenty water on the ice water  
Raising near shore warm 3<sup>rd</sup> fine  
William Henry Shadgate's Birth Day  
Uncle John's eldest Boy Raining Windy seen  
Wild Geese for the first this spring  
4<sup>th</sup> fine Day warm put out some Manure probably  
2 or 3 Rounds but there is Frost in the ground  
cutting stove wood 13 Wild Geese in the  
our hole ice Wearing close to shore  
seen 2 cutters on the lower Road  
5<sup>th</sup> fine Day hailed at night 6<sup>th</sup> made 5 troughs  
Raining Snowing Foggy snowed some to night ice  
wearing opening close to shore No ice and cutter  
came up the ice on J. L. & Dougalls Noaks think  
to J. L. & Dougalls sun warm 7<sup>th</sup> ice opening  
at the arhole. A Man came up the ice  
a foot on J. L. & Dougalls Road hand  
Drawing Wood to the sugar camp  
a fine Day got a Crown the Stack
