the corn stalks over. I went for the Dr last night at midnight for Victoria. we were laying up fence that the wind blew down most of the fore noon. after noon was tying up corn stalks and putting apples.

Tue Oct 25<sup>th</sup> clear and cold. we were drawing stalks this fore noon. digging potatoes in the after noon. The ground froze quite hard last night

Wed Oct 26<sup>th</sup> clear and cool. a very hard frost the river froze partly over. we were drawing corn stalks to day.

Thu Oct 27<sup>th</sup> clear and pleasant we finished drawing the corn stalks this fore noon. after noon Walter was harrowing I was putting apples

Fri Oct 28<sup>th</sup> clear most of the day and pleasant. we cleaned up and took a load of wheat

to Thamesville sold it to J. Syer for 70 per bushel. Victoria no better the Dr down last night. and again to day

Sat Oct 29<sup>th</sup> cloudy and cold. we cleaned up a load of wheat and took it Thamesville. Sold it J. Syer for 70 cts per bushel. the Dr found out to day that Victoria has the typhoid fever settled with William Law this evening and paid him \$30. 70 cents being full of all demands to present date

Sun Oct 30<sup>th</sup> clear and pleasant. no Preaching Victoria no better.

Mon Oct 31<sup>st</sup> clear and fine. Walter commenced fall ploughing. I was gathering apples in the fore noon. after noon Rose & I went to Florence I went to the Quarterly board paid J. Mead for a ~~charn~~ Churn. Victoria no better
