- 5 Fine and bright Jimie got home, he says the roads are going fast
- 6 Fine soft day. I heard that Mrs Gordon is at the manse. To 2 loaves To 2 lbs beef steak charged at Sandys
- 7 Lent 25 to church. Began to rain about 11. a. m
- 8
- 9 To Am hall 30 and 1/2 doz eggs. Sold 3 doz eggs 20th per doz. Got 1 gull coal oil 20 - 1/2 lb tea 20th sugar 25th
- 10 Very fine day the anniversary of my marriage 60 years today - Married in 1862 -
- 11 I was working today To 2 loaves 12
- 12 The boys were at a taffy party at Kennings last night and reported a fine time
- 13 To 2 loaves 12. Mrs Louie Courie brought a bottle of maple syrup Small pox in the village at Abick McDonalds, and at Old Henry Laviolette. John his wife and children are quarantined there

- 14 Fine day not many in church, but off by five 25
- 15 Fine and warm. Boys took home two loads of hay. To 2 loaves 12 Rain in afternoon
- 16 There was thunder and lightning last night and rain. Murdy was at Meadow Bay in fore noon
- 17 On Sunday 14th. The Tetanic a large 2 loaves Rain Steamer on the maiden Trip from Southampton England ran against an iceberg and sank about 1 or 2 a m
- 18 Rain 2 loaves 12 2 lbs butter 50
- 19 2 loaves 12 rain
- 20 Fine day sold 4 doz eggs 80 2 boxes biscuits 35 Jimie got 3 pills 1 box 10. 1 box 25 -
- 21 Lent 25 off
- 22 rain Angus Roy died in G. Hospital Cornwall will be buried here on Wednesday Feb wrote me on Saturday to go to visit them
- 23 Got 44 loaves 24th
- 24 Left for Cornwall Jimie gave me 3.50 got to Cornwall at noon train late Jean met me with a cab. It rained some I do not know what went on at home for I was almost two weeks away. Came back on the 6 of May
- 27 Sold 5 doz eggs 1.00 To biscuits 35 1 gull coal oil 20. Corn 95 1.55 cash 5 - biscuits 25 30
