were stormed on the road, and had
go into some house until morning, then
got to Sandy Roberts on the N. Branch
They left our house about 12 P. M. Murdy
they would stay over night, the storm
was a regular blizzard

Mon 25 Christmas. Jimmie Murdy and myself
were alone to dinner, we had a cootid
and a plum pudding, that Kate
Christie brought (the pudding)

Tues 26 Ann washed 65 This is an idel day 65

Wed 27 An ugly day I had to take on the
" washing, and hang it on the big horse
" Gave Jimmie 10⁰⁰ to pay Major for digging 10 00
" The ditch below the garden
" Gave a cheque on M. Bank for \$99⁰⁰ 99 00
" for my taxes 2 loaves 14 1 gall coal oil 20 34
This is a sad night for Williamstown
The East train for St Polycarp at 6 P. M.
was ran into by the C. P. R. for Montreal
at St Polycarp. 5 persons from Williamstown
were killed, Sandy and Louise Grant Dalgragan
Nathan Demoula, Willie Abrams, son of Albert
Abram, he was working William Campbells farm
west of the village, and Kennedy a Scotchman
