of wheat that we got from bob

of flour per
\$1 5. 3</sup>

20 rain last night & this forenoon bottomed chairs

21 hoed corn the corn cut with the grub

22 heavy rain last night & still raining

23 finished hoeing the corn

Sack went to Brockville with 1 sheep

1 calf alive & 1 calf dead got 12.5

for the sheep 10 for the calf & 15 for

dead one got 3 per lb for the hind quarters

& 2 for the fore quarters

24 no milking to day it rained all day

25 I fixed a spade & hooks to cut the thistles

out of the wheat Sack let the water of

the corn & potatoes

26 worked on the roads for Colman's

commutation money

27 put ashes on the turnips & some

on the corses at the lower end of the
