Thu May 1st clear cloudy light thunder showers and warm. I planted a few potatoes in the garden the boys haling out manure on the corn ground. we moved Anne in the sitting room this morning. She is a little more comfortable to day.

Fri May 2nd cloudy part and moderate. the boys getting out manure I was digging in the garden.

Sat May 3rd clear and pleasant I was digging in the garden and scraping up manure the boys getting out manure.

Sun May 4th cloudy and wet. a fine rain which was much needed.

Mon May 5th clear and hot in the middle of the day. the boys spreading manure. I was grafting a few apple trees this fore noon. after noon. attended the quarterly meeting at Florence in the after noon. Anne no better.

Tue May 6th clear and hot. John was plowing in the manure on the corn ground. Walter and I spreading manure and planting a few potatoes. I finished the grafting.

Wed May 7th cloudy and moderate. not doing much myself. the boys drawing out manure Anne no better.

Thu May 8th cloudy and cool. the boys getting out manure I was planting a few potatoes. Sold the young Bull Baron Sydenham to Albert Field of Harwich co of Kent for \$100.

Fri May 9th cloudy high wind from the North and cool. I was ditching in the lane part of the time. the boys drawing out manure.

Sat May 10th cloudy high wind fore part of the day from the North and cool. warm rain in the evening. and so I was spreading manure part of the day. the boys getting it out John was plowing part of the day Anne very bad to day.

Sun May 11th cloudy and cool.

Mon May 12th cloudy part of the day. was spreading manure part of the day. John was plowing. Anne a little better.

Tue May 13th cloudy and showers. I was spreading manure. John was plowing. Anne not feeling so well this evening.

Wed May 14th cloudy and cool. I was planting potatoes in the fore noon. after noon plowing manure. John was plowing. Anne no better.

Thu May 15th clear part of the day high wind & cool. was piling manure and cutting potatoes. John was plowing.
