LEGAL WEIGHTS AND MEASURES IN CANADA

The legal weights and measures of Canada are the Imperial yard, Imperial pound avoirdupois, Imperial gallon (of 277.27384 cubic inches), and the Imperial bushel. The Imperial gallon is equal to 4.54174 litres, while the wine gallon, used in the United States, is equal to 3.785 litres.

By Revised Statutes of Canada (1886), Chap. 104, it is provided: That in contracts for sale and delivery of any of the undermentioned articles, the bushel should be determined by weighing, unless a bushel measure be specially agreed upon, the weight equivalent to a bushel being as follows:—

Wheat, 60 lbs. Indian Corn, 56 lbs. Rye, 56 lbs. Pease, 60 lbs. Barley, 48 lbs. Malt, 36 lbs. Oats, 34 lbs.

Beans, 60 lbs. Flax seed*, 56 lbs. Hemp, 44 lbs. Blue grass seed, 14 lbs. Lime†, 70 lbs. Castor beans, 40 lbs. Potatoes, 60 lbs. Turnips, 60 lbs. Carrots, 60 lbs. Parsnips, 60 lbs. Beets, 60 lbs. Onions‡, 50 lbs. Bituminous coal, 70 lbs. Clover seed, 60 lbs. Timothy, 48 lbs. Buckwheat, 48 lbs.

By the same Act the British hundredweight of 112 pounds and the ton of 2,240 pounds were abolished, and the hundredweight was declared to be 100 pounds, and the ton 2,000 pounds avoirdupois, thus assimilating the weights of Canada and the United States.

Postal Information.

CANADA—WAR TAX

On and after the 15th April, 1915, a War Tax of one cent will be imposed on each letter and post card mailed in Canada, for delivery in Canada, the United States and Mexico, and on each letter mailed in Canada for delivery in the United Kingdom and British Possessions generally, and wherever the two cent rate applies.

Circulars, catalogues, newspapers, parcels, etc., and correspondence which is legally exempt from postage charges, are not subject to the War Tax.

This War Tax is to be prepaid by the senders by means of a War Stamp for sale by Postmasters and other postage stamp vendors.

In the event of failure on the part of the sender through oversight or negligence to prepay the War Tax on each letter or post card above specified, such letter or post card will be sent to the Dead Letter Office.

It is essential that postage on all classes of mail matter should be prepaid by means of ordinary postage stamps. The War Tax Stamp will not be accepted in any case for the prepayment of postage.

Letter Rates, &c.

Canada.—Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Dominion, 2 cents per oz. If unpaid, such letters cannot be forwarded, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office. If partially prepaid, the letter will be forwarded to its destination and double the deficiency charged on delivery. Letters mailed at any office for delivery at or from the same office, provided that the office is not one at which free delivery by letter carriers is established, are charged 1 cent per oz., and must be at least partially prepaid; otherwise they are sent to the Dead Letter Office. Letters of this nature mailed at and for delivery from an office at which there is a free delivery by letter carriers, are liable to 2 cents per ounce. All postage must be prepaid by Postage Stamps.

Post Cards.—From any place in Canada to any place in Canada, or to the United States or Mexico, 1 cent each. British and Foreign, 2 cts. each.

Private Post Cards.—The face of a Private Post Card may be used for advertisements, illustrations, etc., provided that a clear space of at least $\frac{1}{4}$ inch is left along each of the four sides of the postage stamp, and a clear space $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches long and $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide reserved for the address at the lower right hand corner of the card. Private Post Cards must not exceed a size of 6 inches in length by $3\frac{3}{8}$ inches in width, nor be less than 4 inches in length by $2\frac{3}{8}$ inches in width. Cards exceeding these limits are treated as insufficiently paid letters. The words "Private Post Card" must be written or printed on the face of private post cards addressed to places outside of Canada.

Factorial Private Post Cards which have communications on address side.—Cards which have the back covered by a picture, and one-half of the front to the left of the address space reserved for written communications, are admitted as post cards when addressed to places in Canada, the United States, Mexico, Great Britain, France, Switzerland, Italy, Austria, Montenegro, Persia, Roumania, Belgium, Congo Free State, Denmark, Danish West Indies, Egypt, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden, Netherlands, Hungary, Crete, Hayti, Germany, Portugal, Bulgaria, Transvaal, Orange River Colony, Australia, New Zealand, Holland, Dutch East Indies, Panama, Siam, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Japan, Paraguay, and Tunis. The rate for Canada, Mexico and the United States one cent, and for the other countries two cents. A few of the countries mentioned above do not yet forward the cards described at post card rate, although they have agreed to accept and deliver such cards coming from other countries prepaid at that rate.

Foreign Countries, except United States and Mexico.—Postage on Letters, 5 cents per oz. or fraction thereof, and 3 cents for each additional oz. or fraction thereof. If sent unpaid, double postage will be charged.

United States and Mexico.—The rate on Letters to the United States and Mexico is the same as in Canada, and at least one rate (2 cents) must be prepaid.

It is very important to bear in mind that the postage upon letters for the United Kingdom and all Foreign Countries, except United States and Mexico, is calculated by the half ounce, and double the deficient postage is charged on all unpaid or short-paid letters.

for each 2 ozs. or fraction thereof under the following regulations:

If insufficiently prepaid the packet will be forwarded charged with double the deficient postage, provided at least 1 cent is prepaid.

Packages of Samples and Patterns, addressed to any place in Canada, may be registered by affixing thereto stamps to the value of 5 cents in addition to the postage rate, and provided such packet be handed into the Post Office for registration.

Patterns or Samples must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples, however, of seeds, drugs, &c., which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen, or such like material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

The packet may bear on the *outside* the address of the sender, in addition to the address of the person for whom it may be intended; and also a trade mark or number, and the price of the sample enclosed; *inside*, there must be no enclosure but the samples or patterns themselves.

The particulars, however, of the trade marks, numbers, and prices may be marked on the articles themselves instead of on the outside of the packet, at the option of the sender.

Goods sent for sale or in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or any article sent by one private individual to another which are not actually trade patterns or samples, are not admissible.

Liquids, oils, etc., may be sent by mail in the Dominion if put up carefully in strict accordance with the directions given in the Postal Guide and ascertainable at any post office.

United Kingdom, United States and Foreign Countries.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, when addressed to places in the United Kingdom, must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight; to the United States and other foreign countries, 12 oz., and must be prepaid by postage stamp at the following rates:—1 cent per 2 oz. or fraction of 2 oz., with a minimum prepayment of 2 cents covering a weight of 4 oz., and must not exceed 1 foot in length by 8 inches in width and 4 inches in depth. If in roll form, 12 inches in length and 6 inches in diameter.

Samples of liquids, oils, glass, etc., are admitted as samples provided they are put up in strict accordance with the directions given in the Postal Guide.

Parcel Post with the United Kingdom, Newfoundland, and other British Colonies and Foreign Countries.

Closed Parcels may be exchanged with the United Kingdom, Newfoundland, and most foreign countries and British colonies, under the following regulations:—

1. The dimensions of a Parcel addressed to the United Kingdom must not exceed 30 inches in length or 1 foot in width or depth, nor must the combined length and girth of any Parcel exceed 6 feet. The dimensions of

Registration of Letters.

Persons posting letters containing value should be careful to require them to be Registered, and to obtain from the Postmaster a certificate of receipt for Registration.

The charge for Registration on all classes of matter, in addition to the postage, is 5 cents.

Both the Postage charge and Registration fee should, in all cases, be prepaid by stamp.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a letter: but a Registered Letter can be traced where an Unregistered Letter cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven.

In case of the loss in the Postal Service of a registered article posted in Canada for delivery in Canada, the addressee, or at the request of the addressee, the sender, is entitled to an indemnity, which in no case shall exceed twenty-five dollars, or the actual value of the lost registered article when the same is less than twenty-five dollars, provided no other compensation or reimbursement has been made therefor.

Book Post, &c.

A Book Packet may contain any number of separate books. Limit of weight to Canada, 5 lbs., but a single book, 10 lbs.; United States and Mexico, 4 lbs. 6 oz., and to United Kingdom, 5 lbs. For foreign post, limit of weight, 4 lbs. 6 oz. Size, 30 inches in length, or 1 foot in width or depth.

Book Packets must be open at both ends or both sides, and must not contain any letter or sealed inclosure.

Books for the use of the blind are free of Canada postage, and correspondence passing between blind persons in raised characters is chargeable at the rate of 1 cent per 2 ozs.

The rate on Book Packets for delivery in Canada, Great Britain, the United States and all Postal Union Countries, is 1 cent per 2 ozs.

Miscellaneous Matter.

Miscellaneous matter may pass between places in the Dominion of Canada upon prepayment of the rates indicated below. The regulations of the British Post Office do not admit of the transmission by mail to the United Kingdom (or other countries beyond the sea) of miscellaneous matter as such.

No packet of miscellaneous matter can be transmitted by mail if it exceeds 30 inches in length or 12 inches in width or depth, or over 5 lbs. in weight.

Legal and commercial papers generally are liable to *letter rate* of postage when posted for delivery within the Dominion of Canada.

Printed or written *requests for return* are now recognized on 3rd and 4th class matter, addressed to places within the Dominion, and same will be *returned direct to the sender*, subject to the payment by the sender, on delivery to him through the Post Office, of the full amount of postage to which the article was in the first place liable, together with any charges to which thereon in connection with any deficiency in the original prepayment.

Transient Newspapers.

Transient newspapers and periodicals include all newspapers and periodicals posted in Canada, other than Canadian newspapers sent from the office of publication, and British and foreign newspapers posted by news agents for regular subscribers in Canada. When addressed to any place within the Dominion, the United Kingdom, Barbados, Bermuda, Fiji, Guiana, British North Borneo, Ceylon, Cyprus, Falkland Islands, Fiji, Gambia, Gibraltar, Hong Kong, Jamaica, Leeward Islands, Malta, Mauritius, Newfoundland, New Zealand, Nigeria, Sarawak, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Trinidad, Tobago, Turks Islands, United South Africa and Zanzibar, the Postal Union Rates and Regulations remain in force. They must be prepaid the following rates by Postage Stamp:—

If posted singly and weighing not more than 1 oz., half cent each.
If weighing over 1 oz., one cent per four oz. or fraction of four oz.

Patterns and Samples within the Dominion.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandise and Goods for sale, not exceeding 3 lbs. in weight, may be posted in Canada, to be forwarded to any place within the Dominion, on prepayment by Postage Stamp of a rate of 1 cent

a Parcel addressed to any country other than the United Kingdom must not exceed 30 inches in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

2. A Parcel must not contain any explosive, combustible, or dangerous articles.

3. All Parcels must be securely and substantially packed and closed.

4. Oils, liquids, etc., can only be forwarded if put up with the same security required in connection with their transmission as samples in the ordinary mails. Fragile articles should be packed with special care.

5. Each Parcel must be plainly directed, and such directions must include the name and full address of the person for whom the Parcel is intended.

6. For each Parcel the sender must fill up a Customs Declaration. On this form the sender will supply an accurate statement of the contents and value of the Parcel, also the address thereof, with signature and place of abode of the sender. The Customs Declaration must be securely affixed by mucilage or paste to the Parcel to which it relates.

Parcels from the United Kingdom or any other place beyond the Dominion will be liable to Canadian Customs duties, and under existing regulations must be examined for the purpose by an Officer of the Customs in the presence of the persons addressed.

Prepayment by postage stamp is required in all cases. Parcels must be handed to the Postmaster; in no case should they be dropped into a letter box or other receptacle for mail matter.

Post Office Money Orders.

A War Tax of 2 cents will be charged on each Money Order, irrespective of the amount.

In sending money by mail it is always best to transmit by Money Order, if possible.

Commissions on Money Orders.

On Money Orders issued in Canada for payment in Canada, Antigua, Bahamas, Barbados, Bermuda, British Guiana, Cayman Islands, Cuba, Dominica, Panama Canal Zone, Grenada, Guam, Hawaii, Jamaica, Montserrat, Nevis, Newfoundland, Philippine Islands, Porto Rico, St. Christopher (St. Kitts), St. Lucia, St. Vincent, Tobago, Trinidad, Tutuila (Samoa), Turks Islands, Virgin Islands, and the United States, the Commission is as follows:—

No single Money Order can be issued for more than \$100; but as many of \$100 each may be given as the remitter requires.

Postal Notes.

A War Tax of 1 cent will be charged on each Postal Note irrespective of the amount.

Postal Notes have been placed in the hands of all Money Order and Postal Note Offices in Canada. They offer a convenient and safe means of transmitting small sums through the mails. Canadian Postal Notes are payable only in Canada and the United States.

There are eighteen denominations of Postal Notes; the different amounts and the commissions payable thereon are as follows:

Odd cents may be made up by affixing Canadian postage stamps, not exceeding nine cents in value, to the face of a Postal Note. For instance, 65 cents may be remitted by means of a Note for 60 cents and 5 cents stamps—65 cent will be paid on presentation of the Note.

DEBENTURES AND BONDS

DEBENTURE OR BOND.

The terms "Debenture" and "Bond" are now used so interchangeably that in financial practice the difference in meaning may be said to be almost technical. Theoretically a bond differs from a debenture in that the former is secured by a mortgage deed of trust containing a charge upon certain specific property, while the latter is merely an acknowledgment of a debt. Both forms of contract covenant to repay the principal amount of the debt at a specified time, with interest thereon in the meantime at a fixed rate.

In Canada we speak of municipal debentures, government bonds and corporation bonds. In the United States the term "debenture" is seldom employed. Municipal, government and corporation securities (debentures or bonds) are invariably referred to as "bonds." There is very little significance to be attached to the mere name of the security, the chief thing which we should be concerned about is the manner in which the obligation is secured, what is behind it, etc.

Let us briefly refer to some of the bonds and debentures which are common to this country.

GOVERNMENT BONDS.

These are the securities issued by the Dominion and Provincial Governments. They, of course, constitute the highest grade of security obtainable, but the rate of interest yielded to the investor is, as might be expected, comparatively low. The bonds of the Dominion rank ahead of those of the Provinces, while those of the older settled Provinces are held in higher esteem than those of the newer ones. London heretofore has been the principal place where our Governments have marketed their bonds, although recently Ontario

Purpose—Debentures are issued by cities, towns, etc., to raise money for such useful and essential purposes as schools, sewers, parks, water systems, roads, fire departments, etc. They are, therefore, issued for the betterment of the municipality.

Security—They are secured by the credit of the issuing city or town, etc., and its right and power to levy taxes on all of its taxable property, such taxes being a first charge on all the property in the municipality.

SCHOOL DISTRICT DEBENTURES.

In the Provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta the school sections of the different municipalities are separate and distinct, and have power, apart from the municipalities, to issue debentures and borrow money for school purposes.

Rural districts in these provinces are divided into small school sections, and are under the supervision of the Commissioner of Education for the Province. Each school section may issue its own debentures. All school debentures issued must be approved and countersigned by the Commissioner of Education or his deputy and when so signed are a valid and binding obligation of the issuing section and are not open to contest in any court.

RURAL TELEPHONE DEBENTURES.

In the Provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta provision has been made for the issue of Rural Telephone Debentures, under the supervision of the Minister of Telephones. These debentures are usually issued for small amounts, are secured by a tax levied on the sections served by the telephone, and when countersigned by the

from one individual, by using bonds the money can be secured from many individuals, while the property is transferred as security to a trustee for the bondholders, usually a recognized trust company. When all the bonds have been paid off, with interest, and cancelled, the mortgage can then be discharged. The trust company also looks after the interests of the bondholders, by seeing that the sinking funds are properly kept up and administered and in case of default in payment of interest or principal arranges for foreclosure proceedings, etc. Each bond of an issue ranks equally with every other bond of the same amount, and no bond of the same issue has preference in any way over any other bond.

Such bonds are usually issued in denominations of \$100, \$500 and \$1,000. Most bonds bear interest coupons, although some are issued as fully registered bonds, when interest is paid to the owner by cheque.

TYPES OF BONDS.

First Mortgage Bond is always secured by a deed of trust, and directly covers the property on which it is secured, without being subject to any other lien. There may be other bond issues secured on the same property, but their lien is entirely subsequent to the first mortgage. Because a bond is a "first mortgage" bond one should not necessarily assume that it is a "gilt-edged" security.

Second Mortgage Bond is, as its name indicates, always secured subsidiary to the prior, or first mortgage. If the first mortgage completely covers the value of the property, then, of course, the second mortgage has an inferior standing only. But many first mortgages amount to only a portion of the value of a property, and in these

and Alberta bonds have been successfully offered in Canada and the United States. They carry interest, payable half-yearly, from 4 to 5 per cent., mature in from five to fifty years, and are issued usually in amounts of \$1,000.

MUNICIPAL DEBENTURES.

As this class of investment is most highly regarded by an important and increasing body of investors—large and small—some what greater details are given in respect to it. We will include in this classification a reference to School District and Rural Telephone debentures.

Definition—It is an absolute promise of a county, city, town or township to pay a definite amount on a specified date, and also to pay, periodically throughout the term, interest at a stated rate.

Form—In form, it is self-contained. It states the exact amount that the municipality will pay the holder, and the exact date when it will be paid. When it matures, usually from one to fifty years from date of issue, it is only necessary to deposit it in the bank for collection, or present it to the issuing municipality for payment.

Interest—Attached to each debenture are coupons representing the exact amount of the interest due at the time. Each year or half-year, when an instalment of interest falls due, a coupon is cut off and either presented for payment to the municipality or it may be deposited in the bank. The rate of interest which the debentures of the various municipalities bear differs materially. The large and wealthy cities can, of course, borrow money at a lower rate than that which would have to be paid by relatively small and newer places. The rates are also affected by the monetary conditions at the time the loan is sought. Lately the debentures of the important municipalities have carried interest at $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent, while those of less importance have been issued with rates at 5, $5\frac{1}{2}$ and 6 per cent.

Validity—The contract is very simple. It resembles, somewhat, a promissory note. It is, however, much more formal and binding, in that, in addition to bearing the signatures of the officials of the municipality and the seal of the corporation, certain formal procedures are required to be taken which absolutely ensure its validity. The investor's rights, therefore, are thoroughly safeguarded.

Minister of Telephones are a valid and binding obligation of the telephone section served and are not open to contest in any court.

PAYMENT OF DEBENTURES.

There are several ways in which debentures are payable:

- (1) Payable at the end of a specified term commonly called "straight term" debentures. With this form an annual sinking fund is usually provided, so calculated as to be sufficient to pay off the debt at maturity.
- (2) Payable in equal annual instalments of principal, commonly called an "instalment" or "serial" debenture.
- (3) Payable in equal annual instalments of principal and interest, commonly called an "annuity" debenture.

In the case of classes 2 and 3 no sinking fund is necessary, as the debt is being paid off yearly, as the instalments fall due. This method is usually employed by the smaller towns, school sections, rural telephones, etc.

Form (1) is usually employed by the larger cities and municipalities which have adequate machinery to look after a sinking fund.

LOAN AND MORTGAGE COMPANY DEBENTURES.

Loan, Investment and Mortgage Companies have power to borrow money by means of debentures. These are issued in the form of a simple promise to repay money borrowed, at a specified time, with interest in the meantime, payable by coupons attached. They are secured by the covenant or promise to pay of the issuing company, generally run for a term of from two to five years, and carry interest from 4 to 5 per cent. The loan companies have been quite successful for many years past in placing large amounts of their debentures with investors in Great Britain.

RAILWAY, ELECTRIC RAILWAY, GAS COMPANY, POWER COMPANY, WATER COMPANY, INDUSTRIAL COMPANY AND OTHER BONDS.

Bonds are issued by practically all classes of companies and corporations. They may be said to be mortgages divided into many portions. In this way, when a corporation would find it difficult or impossible to borrow sufficient money

cases a second mortgage is frequently well secured and attractive as an investment.

Third, Fourth and Fifth Mortgage Bonds are, as their names indicate, secured subsequent to the several preceding issues and require no separate comment, except that the mere fact of their being subsidiary to several issues does not of itself make them inferior in value. Other things being equal, the title of a bond signifies very little.

Consolidated Mortgage Bond is generally created as a result of a reorganization, a readjustment of finances, or for the purpose of providing new capital where a property is already mortgaged to some extent, and a second or third mortgage would not be well enough secured to warrant a ready sale.

General Mortgage Bond is of the same class as a consolidated mortgage. This is sometimes called a "blanket" mortgage, and is frequently issued when there is but a single first mortgage on the property. It is sometimes partly secured by second mortgage and partly by first mortgage but usually it is merely subsequent to two or more first and sometimes even consolidated or less well secured liens. When this is the case a sufficient amount is generally reserved to take care of the other bonds as they mature.

Prior Lien Bond is not necessarily a bond of prior security at all, except in a qualified sense. The term "prior lien," as applied to railroad bonds nowadays, connotes something entirely different from what would naturally be supposed.

Debenture Bond is not a mortgage, but simply a promissory note, or promise to pay. It is usually issued in the same form as other bonds. While both principal and interest are an obligation of the issuing company, yet in the case of default the holder cannot foreclose as he can in the case of a mortgage bond. In this respect the debenture is in very much the same position as a cumulative preferred stock, with the important exception that the latter usually carries a voting power, while the former does not. But debenture bonds, like all the rest, get their investment status largely through the character of the corporation issuing them.

Collateral Trust Bond is an indirect mortgage on a piece of property, made through the deposit with a trustee of other securities which are usually directly secured. Sometimes, how-

DEBENTURES AND BONDS—Continued.

ever, the collateral so deposited consists of both stocks and bonds, and, in some cases, of stocks only. Like other kinds of bonds, there are "all sorts and conditions" of collateral issues, some being secured by one collateral only and others being secured by a heterogeneous variety of good, bad, and indifferent stocks and bonds. In some cases bonds are secured partly by deposit of collateral and partly by mortgage on some property. In such instances they are described as "mortgage-collateral trust bonds," etc.

Convertible Bond is an issue which carries a right or privilege for conversion into some other issue of bonds or stocks. There are many kinds of convertible bonds, and they carry convertible clauses for many and diverse reasons.

Guaranteed Bond is one the payment of which is specifically "guaranteed" by endorsement or otherwise by another corporation. There are many guaranteed bond issues in the railroad field, carrying guarantees of various kinds. In some cases the interest only is guaranteed, in others, both the principal and interest.

Assumed Bond is in some respects similar to a guaranteed bond, being an issue, the payment of which, both principal and interest, is "assumed" by the controlling company. The effect is in some sense the same as a guaranty and the bond becomes, as a result, a direct obligation of the assuming corporation.

Income Bond is one on which the payment of the interest is dependent on income. That is to say, while the principal is a mortgage and legally must be taken care of at maturity, the interest rate is not a "fixed charge," and no foreclosure

proceedings can be instituted in case the interest is not paid. The payment of the latter is entirely dependent on the earnings of the company, it being generally agreed that if the interest is earned it shall be paid; otherwise, not. There are several classes of income bonds. Some are not a mortgage. These are usually known as "debenture incomes." Others bear a cumulative clause, which provides that interest when unpaid shall accrue, and all accrued interest be paid or satisfied before the current interest is paid. These are known as cumulative income bonds. Still others are convertible into securities of another class, such as preferred stock, and are known as convertible incomes. Others have preference over inferior issues and are known as preference incomes.

Sinking Fund Bond is one which carries a provision setting aside a portion of earnings year by year for the purpose of retiring the bonds at or before maturity. There are many kinds of sinking fund clauses in bonds and they act in several different ways. The best known form is a provision requiring the company to deposit with the trustee periodically a certain sum of money, sometimes a percentage of the gross or net earnings, sometimes a percentage of the outstanding issue, and sometimes simply a fixed sum of money each year; the trustee then either calling in by lot a sufficient number of the issue to exhaust the amount of money he has received, or, if more are offered at the callable price (this price is usually a premium figure, 102, 105, 110, etc.), then buying the bonds in the open market at the lowest prices offered. The bonds so acquired are then cancelled and thus the issue is gradually reduced.

Other forms of sinking funds are where the bonds so acquired by the trustee are "kept alive," the interest which is paid thereon being added to the fund and used for the purpose of buying still more bonds. Still other funds require that the bond issue itself be allowed to run until maturity and that the money set aside in the fund be invested in other securities, and thus the whole fund is held intact until the entire bond issue actually matures.

Underlying Bond is a general term describing any issue which precedes or is prior in mortgage security to some subsequent issue.

Refunding Mortgage Bond is an issue especially created for taking care of maturing issues, supplying additional capital, etc., and for reducing fixed charges.

Participating Bond is a modern term describing an issue which is entitled to participate in income or profits, under certain conditions, beyond its fixed rate of interest.

Equipment Bond is an issue created to acquire equipment, and is secured directly upon locomotives, cars and so forth. It frequently happens that a railroad finds it necessary to increase its equipment rapidly in order to handle a growing business in the most economical way. In most cases, large purchases of this kind involve the borrowing of money, as railroads do not always have funds available for such purposes. In view of this situation, "equipment trusts" or equipment bonds have been invented. These usually run for short periods only, generally being paid off in instalments or serially, ranging over several years.
