25th Sunday The Annunciation of St. Mary (Raining
 hailing freezing snow and fine & Wind some cold)

 at Hamilton to help them at the sawing stove Wood
 with the sawing machine up at the store at night a very fine

 I sawing stones to the W day at the cattery I stop
 at Johns all night freezing hard these nights Sunday 1st
 of April All Fools Day I came from Hamilton early

 Pete Rookay Anterne and Levy Bogle came put up the
 clock and set it going gave him 5 lb of sugar
 Frank Laffente and his Boy in the Bush I seen a cutter
 crossing summer road its John Hamilton
 a going with Tommy Jack and John James across
 to Dunbar as they are bound for California 3rd
 John Hamilton and Gordon came down for the Pan horse
 and cutter cleaning the cellar Peggy and George crossed
 and came back to night as there was a big hole at
