& would not do his chores he milked two
on the storm & one after I was so glad Fanny
came early. she was here & washed pans & strain
ed the milk. the rain came down in torrents
Tues 6 Fanny skimed the milk & strained the
milk & scalded the churn & done the churning
I had a Terrill. Fanny working the butter. had 5^{lbs}
at night I had in dake the cloth of my hand
to skin the milk & wash pans then my hand swells
up & gets painful. Fanny gone to ferry to see
Hattie came over in day & has a bad cold
Wed a thunder storm this morning & one in night

it don't just rain it just pours. everything is
suffering with water the road looks a lake & the
pasture field low I never saw so much rain
Mr Haglitt buried today he died Sunday
Wed 7 Archie & Paul run a furrow around the
potato patch & the east of the barn & churned
& washed the butter. & cleaned the chicken
coops they were in a terrible state. I took

him orders to do it rained for four days running
Thurs 8 The hens have kept me busy two hours some
evening after them eating the beans down at far in the
ground as they can see them & the punkent & gins
Paul & Berdie brought Marjorie home on the after
noon Hattie & Paul went to Sheppawa got the
insurance bonded to 125 paid the took 10[¢] the
@ 12^½ per lb 125 & 2^½ doz eggs @ 17.42[¢]. Will went
to Black creek & up on the river. Marjorie out along
Friday 9 they are sawing wood to the other house
Marjorie set spring brought. I churned in day
but my head got a cherry I could not work
got the calves out they were in a terrible state
Marjorie got things fixed on the line at something
to tie them up
Sat 10 Doulph excursion the girls & ches factory
went rained most of the day Marjorie had
her hands more than full butter to work bread
to bake. & I was so sick I could not work & think
