 place. Pans became Grand Mother
 was here. I took Mary & Susanne
 to Florence's & brought her home
 Aug 2 I finished cutting Knoll then
 he took her horses & Ben's binder
 & cut for Ben's till night
 A & Henry finished dressing wheat
 14 loads then I shocked oats. This
 was my last day teaching school
 Dan Ramer came this evening and
 took his son Martin home. It
 very fine. Cool wind spring slow
 this evening
 3 Henry helped R. Milroy thresh A M Ben
 helped at McCaughts for us P.M. A & J
 gathered shovels with forks A M. Stan
 man W. Booth helped A finish shocking
 Oats P.M. I asked hands to help
 us to thresh on Monday A.M. I & J
 drew in 2 loads mixed grain P.M.
 W. Cooler fine wind from N.W.
 Henry May & Anne started about

3 P.M. to go some where near Albin's
 to stay all night
 Sunday 4 at home David Reesor's were here
 to dinner & Florence's were here to supper
 very fine. Clear & cool a very fine day
 5 Had Dan Reesor with his Machine
 to thresh A.M. Threshed 4 hours about 140 Bus
 Fall Wheat about Pans mixed grain &
 about 250 Bus barley. Henry helped Ben
 thresh P.M. I & J took in 7 loads
 Oats P.M. Very fine day not so warm
 6 we drew in 4 loads Oats A.M. Stan
 his man helped P.M. with team we took
 in 14 loads Oats P.M. which makes
 25 loads out of big field. I & W
 Bishop & Avery Degees came this
 morning to sheet up the Silo about
 9 o'clock A.M. Degees fell about
 14 feet & hurt his feet so that he could
 not stand the board that he stood
 on fell on his head & cut his forehead
 open about 1 1/2 in he seems all right
 again I brought home some Chop
 on W. fine & not so warm wind
 from East a little like rain
 I forgot to say that we got 5 sacks of
 Timothy seed out of the wheat and
 there is still some in the wheat
