- 27 Bright day, but wild. To 4 loaves 24 one box biscuits 24 Sold apt milk 5 24
- 28 Very hard frost last night, sold 1 gall milk 20 24
- 29 Bright day, but cold. Marion and Jimmie went to Pinnings last night to a small party Mrs Pigeon paid \$3.00 yesterday Birdie is not well today, she mopped my room yesterday 2 spools W. thread No. 10, 24 10
- 30 Very cold. Birdie very little better
- 31 Cold enough out so cold as yesterday To 4 loaves 24, Jimmie settled with the chaplains for cutting 10 cords of wood \$10.00 John Maclean came about 2 P.M. Birdie and the children went home

This has been a very stormy month, and this week has been very cold. Mercury down lower than 20 for a few days. The papers say there were about 700 babies died in Toronto this month from want, the mothers almost starving. I think they are foreign emigrants and had nothing.

- 1 Saturday. ^{1 month} The storm came in with a fearful storm. Wind from the east, and snow, large drifts on the roads, one at the end of Wellington Street at noon it had to be tramped out to let a sleigh full of wood pass. Sold 5 doz of eggs 30⁰⁰ per doz, 1.50. To 2 lbs lard 16⁰⁰ per 32⁰⁰ lb coarse salt 5⁰⁰ 4 loaves 24 61
- 2 Sunday. None from here in church. Very few if any there. The wind is now from the West and is cold, if any thing worse than yesterday
- 3 Fine and bright. People all breaking roads
- 4 Cold To bread 20, coal oil 20, on the due bill for the eggs 40
- 5 Very cold Mercury was down to 90 in our village this morning 55
- 6 Mrs Brown (Marial Hunt) and Mary Macdonald spent last evening here. To butter 60 60
Molasses 25, rice 25, corn starch 10, ginger 10 10
50 cts from the egg sale. Sold 4 wts milk 20
- 7 Cold stormy day, wind from the west
On Saturday the King of Portugal and his elder son (the crown prince) were assassinated and his younger son was wounded. They were in a carriage and the Queen mother with them when six men ran up and deliberately shot them. Sold 3 qts milk 1 lb of 6 6
- 8 Fine day, but very cold, To 4 loaves 24 24
- 9 Cold day. The roads are very heavy muddy at the manse to dinner. 2.61
