

May 1914

- 1 Friday Fine and bright, cold wind  
Bought 12 lbs butter from Harry Brown 25 for 63-00  
Jimmie was assessing on N. Black River  
East and South Lancaster, Murdy away  
Mrs Govin was in last night, and Mar-  
garet, she brought me a loaf of bread  
and a rice pudding
- 2 I was up for breakfast, the first time  
since the 17<sup>th</sup> January. I did some sweep-  
ing and a little cooking  
Yesterday I sold at McCrinnons 4 doz  
and ten eggs = 87 cts, but 2 lbs of lard 40  
a duckbill 48 cts
- 3 Fine day but 25 to church <sup>from Larsons</sup> 1 qt milk
- 4 Dull day Jimmie off before I was up. I went  
to the garden took in a pail of earth to  
plant seeds in
- 5 Mrs McLeod, front Charlottenburgh buried here  
today in St Marys Cemetery, Duncan McMan  
buried in St Andrews Cemetery in afternoon  
Far was down with McMartins funeral Mc died  
of Pneumonia aged 45. Harry Brown sold me  
10 lbs of butter 25 = 2-50 - 70 2 loaves 12  
1 can Salmon 25, 3 Lemons 7, Mrs Duncan R  
McLennan and husband called she gave  
me a little loaf of sugar George Ferguson  
brought us 3 gall of maple syrup
- 6 Very fine day Jimmie off assessing with  
Campbell Burgess Mrs W Whitteman and  
Mrs Govin called
- 7 Fine day Jimmie got home, at 4 P. M, he  
has a very bad cold, have 20 chicken  
root from Dr. M. Robertson, planted them on  
the north side of house 2 loaves 12
- 8 Jimmie finished assessing 1 gall coal oil 20

May 1914

- 9 Got at McCrinnons for egg due call 1 bag rook  
oats 25, flaked corn 10, <sup>from my savings</sup> bread 12 47  
Milk 42 cts set, a hen on duck eggs 42
- 10 Lent 25 to church I have another loaf 25
- 11 Murdy went to Montreal by McCarson  
Mrs Santino paid 7 dollars
- 12 Ann Hall 35. She has a cold I am just from one 35  
cold to another Nelly Roy Ferguson called
- 13 Cold, rain, Jessie McKingie called. Jimmie is some  
better
- 14 Fine bright morning. sold, 70 2 loaves 12, Kattie <sup>tea</sup> 12
- 15 I am not getting much better. Still about fast  
in bed
- 16 Dull, some rain. Jimmie raking the lawn  
70 4 loaves 24 cts Milk 42 66
- 17 Lent 1.25 to church. 1<sup>st</sup> is for Missions, 25 for 6 pounds 1.25 10
- 18 Fine warm day, Murdy sprayed the apple  
trees, and currant bushes
- 19 Fine day Jimmie went to Lancaster to Dentie  
Murdy not up yet, he was sitting up at a  
10. P. M, wake, I was up to breakfast
- 20 Fine day looks like rain. 70 1 gall coal oil 20
- 21 Roman Holyday. Fine but cold 2 loaves 12 12
- 22 Cold and some rain. Cousin Mary and Maggie  
came to see me, she brought me a white cake  
and 10 buns.
- 23 Jimmie had Gregor Stewart 7/2 day piling wood in  
shed gave him 50<sup>cts</sup> 70 2 loaves 12, Corrie diggery 12
- 24 Fine bright day Sunday off 25 1/2 Garden, 1.25 from me 25
- 25 Dull like rain kind of cold. Jimmie has a count  
here today. Perkins and 70 2 loaves 12 12
- 26 Fine day Farquhar Cairnie and brought  
Montreal to put her on pasture  
Ann Hall 3/4 day 75<sup>cts</sup> 2 loaves 12 87  
Paid George Ferguson 33.00 for the 3 gall syrup 3 00
