

Wm Croton May 1887

Wed May 25th clear and pleasant - we were hauling manure from the barn, Charley Brownlee helping us.

Thur May 26th cloudy and cool, drizzling showers this afternoon, we finished drawing manure in the fore noon, the rest of the day planting in corn where the ground was to try to start it the first time

Fri May 27th cloudy and cool, we finished the corn planting the fore part of the day, we took a load of wheat to Dresden this afternoon sold to Powell for \$1 per bushel

Sat May 28th clear cool morning and evening hot in the middle of the day, we cleaned up and took a load of wheat to Dresden

Sun May 29th clear and pleasant -

Mon May 30th cloudy, thunder shower in the evening, high wind from the south we were cultivating and hoeing corn

Croton June 1887

Tue May 31th cloudy and wet a good deal of water has fell the last twenty four hours which was much needed. Walter and I was taking the dirt of the corn he cultivated yesterday Wed June 1st cloudy and wet most of the day, not doing much to day.

Thur June 2nd cloudy and some showers. I was spending up thistles in the fore noon, after noon hoeing corn, the ground messy. Walter and Rose went to the Grangers picnic at port Stanley

Fri June 3rd cloudy most of the day, we were cutting up thistles this fore noon, after noon hoeing corn

Sat June 4th clear and hot we were hoeing corn,

Sun 5th cloudy and rain in the Evening

Mon June 6th cloudy and hot, rain last night we were hoeing corn and potatoes
