2 heavy rain this morning we went away on the Express yesterday Her Mother came to see her before she went

3 I spoke for sunset it went to young for Bee last night brought her home at noon today Billie this afternoon Henry drew 4 loads of ashes Rev Mr Brown preached this morning Mr Nicholson at night next come on the Express this morning

5 Mrs Highcock went home with Albert at noon he came yesterday Billie went home with Bizer

6 I split wain & other fixings we intend to kill the hogs & care to tomorrow Henry ~~draw~~ ^{draw}

7 we killed the hogs & care Wallace helped fine day we skinned the big hog on the slough

8 He came out & we culup the hogs & care & salted them the big hog 376 lb we put a barrel of side

9 meal of her 210 lbs the other hog was 238 fine day rain most of the day but come home from Glasta he went out on Tuesday with the children to see Ellen they are all well ~~at the~~

10 Mr Nicholson preached this afternoon we intend to have the communion tomorrow

11 had the Communion Mr Nicholson preached

12 there was a Missionary Meeting in the Church at 3 o'clock the Rev Mr Gallagher Mr Brewster & Mr Nicholson addressed the meeting very few ~~at the~~ ^{car} out them A Cashman gave 3 dollars Mr Thompson 8 ^{or} 5 dollars & 30 cents Taken up

13 A & Henry Mr Goughler came here about 10 o'clock to plow they finished what was to plow at the Road they plowed in the Northwest field by the canal from Parry Saund on the Express West went to Della on the

14 A & Henry plowed in the South part of the ^{Express} field west field arriving here of rain most of the day

15 A & Henry plowed in the same field
