Mrs Mary Hamilton of Camiltons Island
Departed This Life at about 8 o'clock this Evening
much Respected and very well Liked by all
who knew her 13th East Wind a very Fine Day
Sheared 9 of the Sheep to Day Sowed Turnips to Day
Ed Renshaw here Fernandez Fishing went to the water
Coty of the Drudge for Eggs got 6 Doz not paid to
to Day 14th a very Fine Day Mrs Hamilton
Buried to Day Fernandez went from here
to the Funeral My Niece came from Cornwall on
Her Wheel 15th a Fortunate Day Jessi and
Fernandez to Cornwall on the Boat
Ploughed through the Potatoes & Wind Fine Day
Gonia not Well she is in Bed cleaning the
Corn 16th Unfortunate Day a very Fine Day
Leander to church Gordon here took the Papers
Fernandez came 17th a very Fine Day Mr Webster
and Daughter and Nephew from Glasgow Brought
me 2 Handsome Pictures 1 an alarm clock Bought
Butter and Eggs had their Dinner in Cedar Grove
Gave me a peach and a Banana a very
Fine old Scotchman and his Nephew the same
at the Potatoes Below the Grove Drudge 6 Doz Eggs

James Cameron Island 18th June 1901
Unfortunate Day. The ever Memorable
Battle of Waterloo Fine Turned cloudy some
Drops of Rain East Wind Stanley and Leander at
the Corn Went up to the Bay set a Stump afire
and a Brush-heap 19th Fine at the Corn and Potatoes
Working some at the Elm Stone Boat Went to Fish
got a Doz of Perch commenced to Rain Wind
Coty here got Buttermilk Leander crossed Fernandez too
Thunder and Lightning had his Regimental coat and Pants on
to Summerston Ricked the Wool Gonia up to Day
Put the Plough through the Potatoes to cut the Weeds
20th Accession of Queen Victoria Fine Went
to Fish got 3 Went on the Little Island North side
Mr Atwater and Randolph Passed Fishing
Finished Weeding the Corn and Potatoes First
time Washing the Bags at the River Fernandez
Working at the Drain from the cellar Sots
of Boats a going East Wind Thunder and Lightning
Rained Mr Atwater and Randolph came in
out of the Rain The Columbian went Down
Mr Coty from the Drudge to 6 Doz of Eggs
Last Day of Spring That 18 Doz to be paid for 72
Fernandez crossed to night a calf to Day 2.16
21st Sir enters Cancer Summer Begins Fine
Morning Foggy smoky cleared off Leander went
to Lancaster for Nails sea-going vessel went
up Fernandez crossed put some Boards overhead
Stanley Drew some Wood with the Waggon Killed the calf
Cut his Leg Fernandez Brought a Sledgehammer
here Set Fires to 4 Brushheaps Heard that John
Mc Donald Kenneth came home 22nd Our DONS
Birth Day Gonia in Williamtown Fernandez at the
Cellar Drain Broke the Big Stone that was in it Working overhead
awful heavy Lightning this Evening very hot to Day heavy Rain
to night
