William came to Chop and Rich  
Mr Crispen and Mr Wight here for  
to see if I had Hay for sale had a  
Drop of good stuff Promised to come  
tomorrow a very fine Day 18<sup>th</sup> Mr Crispen  
2 Men came Basins for a load had 2  
Barrel of Herring for me 2 1/2 lbs of Tea  
and cheese and a Bottle Mr J H Baker and  
P Buchanan and Galemeau here  
had 2 Teams 2 Tons of Hay 20 Cows  
Brought the children Paper & sweets  
Gave Gordon a Knife Lots of Papers  
Got an upsett on the ice Gave  
William a dozen of Herring 15<sup>th</sup> Mr  
P Buchanan and Frank Mayville  
came took a Ton and the River 20  
Feet 8 inches long 15 1/2 and 20 inches wide  
oak 16 Feet long 11 inches wide going to  
come for the other some time next  
Week had a Bottle Mr Stebbins  
came got 1/2 Ton on account of James  
Hopkins fixing my Boat Mr Stebbins  
got the 8 Barrelled Pistol Mr Crispen  
came gave me 12 1/2 Dollars 10 in Bills 2 1/2  
in gold Had a Bottle Brought apples  
and sweetmeats to the children he sto  
Send me 1/4 of Beef at 3 cents and a syrup Barrel  
at 1 Dollar Promised him the stack and  
1/2 of the West end of the Barn Gave William an  
order for 2 Dollars

Mr James Cameron, Jan 15<sup>th</sup> 1872  
James J. Cameron's Buildings  
Burnt this morning 10 head of <sup>called</sup> ~~Beast~~ <sup>Beast</sup>  
and a great many other things about  
his Buildings gave William an iron for  
his sleigh William has 5 1/2 cords to night  
20<sup>th</sup> Stormy went to the Bush 21<sup>st</sup> A fine  
Day a fine Day 22<sup>nd</sup> Old Bodway Dead  
Stormy 23<sup>rd</sup> William Chopping sent an  
Order to A. Baker for Flour and ink  
Cutting the Hay in the East End of  
the Barn 24<sup>th</sup> Charles Tupper's Birth  
Day did not get the Flour got the ink  
Got 16 Bushels of Potatoes took them  
from Hammonds cellar A. Baker  
to comm. all for Flour Mr Crispin  
2 sleighs came for Hay Bascha and  
Labuff Broke on the stacks gave  
Richard William some Hay for the horse  
Pretty frosty Morning sent down two  
Hay Knives to cut the snow sent a letter  
to Mr Crispin for 45 lb of Flour one of those  
sacks 25<sup>th</sup> Labuff and Bascha here took 2 loads of  
the East side commenced the south side of the West  
mow Cutting it in 2 Mr Crispin came took me  
a Fresh Codfish about 3 lb selling them at 8 cents a lb  
a Sack of Flour 4 3 lb took his dinner with him had  
a Dish of Oysters Crackers and cheese I had a good  
Feast of the Oysters got a 100 Weight of Flour from A. Baker  
William took it over gave William some Hay and Herring
