6 Geordy drew 2 loads of wood from Bruce McNeil's  
woods here & placed part of the field East of  
the Barn for roots fine day

7 Ad and Geordy went to the Chantry this afternoon  
to plow & saw a some rats there & some part  
of the peace fine rain this forenoon

8 Albert Steacock hevi last night he brought  
out a Radler for Charles Brownstrong he took it to  
this morning he brought me some Sweet Corn &  
planted it in the garden east side fine day

9 heavy rain last night Ad came home from the  
Chantry with a sore eye there is a stie on it

10 I planted a row of the horn carrot at the barn  
that was all a paper would plant I planted a paper  
of Summer Savacoy in the garden near the grapevine

11 planted peas & some Murnony pea  
in the garden

12 Rev W<sup>r</sup> Nicholson preached this morning Mr Braun at night  
13 hard frost this morning Geordy took a Radler  
to Robert Davison in Exatt he did not take it  
he brought it back he mowed the middle part  
of the East middle field to the South ditch so that  
we can pasture all the fields

14 Geordy Wallace, James Suttiner went to the 6 concessions  
to work at 2:00 eye is gaining. Geordy to go to Kingston this  
afternoon to the sign and it needs about 7:30 this morning
