McGregor died today. Maiden name Margaret  
Janison, married two weeks. The papers say  
there is a destructive fire raging in Bal  
timore (Md), began on Sunday, 125,000,000

and Japan I made a small washing
- 18 Fine day. Boys drew a jug of wood  
Jimmie bot. a jar 25. to carry milk  
Got 1 gall at John Lis for 20. Dunn was buried  
Sandy M Naughton <sup>Providence</sup> died today aged 85
- 19 Fine day. Boys drew 2 loads of straw  
Minnie Pan, called left her horse, she went  
visiting. May called.
- 20 Sandy Brown buried today. John M L Taylor  
had to stirrup & tea. Boys in bush. Minnie  
took her horse and went home  
70 4 lbs butter from factory. Not paid
- 21 I was in church McKellar of Martinstown preached
- 22 70 1 gall milk. Boys drawing wood 1 lb tea
- 23 Stormy. boys at wood
- 24 Cold and stormy. Still at the wood

- 26 Fine 1 gall milk Fine day
- 27 Turning soft
- 28 Mr Coburn of Lunenburg, preached at Sunnyside  
Wet day not many in church in morning.

Sold 33 eggs. 68 cts. 70 1/2 lb Cream Tartar 20 1/2 gall coal oil  
1 lb onions 5 Molasses 18
