Nov 18 heavy rain last night & to day with thunder banked the house in the afternoon getting very cold

19 hard frost last night gathered the cabbage fine crop

18 went to cantown & heard the Revd Mr Gorman preach the ground hard frozen

19 thrashed 30 shares of oats for straw for to make cider. Jack & the boys cleaned some of the peas John Yonge came ^{here}

20 made a shaving horse for John Yonge he went home to day bad road

21 finished cleaning the peas had 57 1/2 bush snowed about 3 inches George Two ^{the thrasher} brought

22 made cider for Rob Armstrong Wm Daves & James Every about 5 barrels

23 made cider Rob Armstrong George Two & Mr Hazelwood & 1 barrel for ourselves in all about 5 barrels

24 went to Bryn bought 2 2 1/2 lb sole leather 1.5 per lb got 4 lb of upper leather which made 13 3/4 lb that we had got from Henry McDonald at 2 per lb he got 2 barrels of snow apple at 8.9 per barrels made 17.5 & 9 paid a Henry 10 which made 27.5

25 went to cantown & heard the Rev Mr McGehee preach he is just come from Ireland roads very slippery

26 made our own cider fine say

~~27~~ rain & some snow in the afternoon

27 Jack took 3 Cows to George Welsh fine say in wagon

28 made cider for David Tennant & the Widow Phillips & Co Armstrong fine say

29 went to Henry Manharts with 7 Cows to the Southbury Run

30 drew some wood & made an axe helve hard frost
