- 9 Sun cold in the forenoon, now, 10 P.M., wft like rain we had a very good prayer meeting, subject, 13 Chr 1 Corinthians
- 11 Last evening I went with Jimmie to Lancaster to hear a lecture from Edgum Hill of St. Andrew's church Montreal. Subject, "Prince Charles" James McArthur of Newmarket sang a number of Jacobite songs, Mrs. Burnett played the accompaniment, tickets 25 =
