 was in A.M. looking at drain and drain also washed
 190 to buy some pigs. P.M. Willie S.D.R. windows
 No 2 H turned them over they were very wet. Alan
 Armstrong & Lea and Mr Allan field competition
 judge here P.M. judged our oats at 7.5. ^{Willie cut}
