- 14 Bright day. Jimmie cleaned the furnace pipes and kitchen pipes, 70 2 loaves 12 1 gall coal 32
- 15 Fine soft day. My Sunday off 25 25
- 16 Wrote to Marion. 70 box biscuit on 14th 25
- 17 Cold and bright in morning Ann Hall Murdy went away yesterday, got twice Jimmie went to Cornwall. Got 4 lbs butter from Factory sent an order for 50^{cts} of cards to D. B. Cook 40
- 18 70 2 lbs lard 35^{cts} 2 lbs suet at M. Antiques paid 25^{cts} 40
4 lbs B. sugar 25^{cts} 1/4 lb ginger 10 35
- 19 Ugly day. raining in morning turned to wet snow Annie M. Danell (Tailor) was buried today died in Montreal, her niece Edith Wild came up with the remains. Jimmie & Murdy went both to Lancaster to meet the remains 70 2 loaves 12

- 21 4 loaves 24^{cts} 2 lbs lard 38^{cts} ginger 10 32
- 22 Sunday off 25
- 23 Mary, Gert and Mrs McPherson came in evening and remained to tea. Mary brought me a white cake, and a plum pudding made in a 3 lb lard pail. Ann Hall came at night and plucked a 15 lb turkey. A M^d cutting long wood 15
- 24 A. M. D finished cutting the wood, put boards across in cellar. Plucked the fowl of her house, left about 3.15
- 25 Fine bright day. We were alone for dinner. Lasked Tax and Gear. but she thought the drive too rough. Margret Doan called and brought me three samples of cakes they got from Major General Doan & Mrs. Red. Scotch Bunch cake and a white cake with nuts in it
- 26 I am doing a few chores left from yesterday
- 27 Fine bright morning. The childrens entertainment comes off tonight

- 27 I made ham sandwiches, and went along with the dishcloths. That Ann Hall took home from the Town social and washed. Turned kind of stormy in evening
- 28 Another fine day. The entertainment was said to have been good - 2 loaves 12 12
- 29 Very fine mild day. Sunday off 25
- 30 Rain all fore noon cheque from Factory 3.14
- 31 Ann Hall h. day 35 1 gall. coal oil 20. rooled oats 35
25 2 loaves 12 37

On the 21st the box came from Eatons. I sent an infants coat and cap to Marion for baby. The coat was white cashmere 3.50. The cap angora wool 1.50
I got a silk quilted vest from Marion
