- 6 Very high wind, dust flying like snow in winter Mrs Fraser of the Presbyterian College Montreal preached, My off 25. James Ingwall & R. Burns 15
- 7 Turned cold in evening. To cracked corn 85 85
- 8 Looked like rain had a slight shower Ann Hall 35
- 9 To 4 lbs butter from Factory 27 p lb 105 1.05

- 22 Fine day. Ann Hall 40 she pulled the B. Currants
