1 Fine day Mrs J Grant went to The Glen in evening. All our young folk went to the picnic very hot in afternoon

2 Hot Hot, Mercury 96

3 Hot mercury up to 96 bread 12

4 Hot mercury up to 97 70 4 loaves 24 Jimmie
I killed a hen yesterday. had it for dinner today. Sold two calves yesterday one 4 weeks old one 18 days, got \$10.00 for the two. Began to send milk to factory today 57 lbs of milk Jimmie by salt 10

5 Another hot day I am making a petticoat for Agnes, sewing by hand 70 bread 12, Jimmie biscuit 10, cookies 12 Agnes Johnson left for Martintown, Jim drove her in evening

6 Still hot bread

7 Rain today which has cooled the air. Jimmie drove Marion to Lancaster she will go to Cornwall

8 We slept well last night, but it is getting hot again 5 loaves 30 Jimmie
J. P. M. L. came to church and took the girls home 94 in the shade

9 Does so at 8 a.m., now 2 P. M. 95 Jimmie is at the hen, with very little help. We did not make a fire for dinner. had lemonade instead of tea Mrs St Thomas paid \$2.00

10 Hot 90, Ann Hall 8 boxes 45
Murdy went to Millocke Jimmie had Jim Smith and Jim Murdy, put in 7 loads of hay

11 Not so hot, Jimmie cutting and raking 70 pens green 30 3 loaves 18
Circus in Cornwall

July

13 Mrs J Lavolette paid \$5.00

14 70 50 lbs flour 1.40 2 loaves 12 lemons 10 1.62
Sugar 25 1 lb biscuit 12 37

15 70 20 lbs sugar 1.00 20 lbs oats 25, 1 gall coal oil 1.40
Murdy went to Cornwall, William J Urquhart buried today died on the 13th
John Dingwall East River died this morning
Revised B. currents today, the first fruit I preserved this summer

16 Cloudy in morning, My off 1.00

17 Began to rain and rained all day poured some times. Funeral of John Dingwall today in the rain
70 1 gall paint oil 1.30 at chaps John's 1.30
and 2 lbs washing soda 4 2 loaves 16

18 Dull 70 bread 12 Jimmie painting kitchen 12

19 Fine 2 loaves 12 " " " 12

20 Got the poles from from Eatons
70 6 oranges 25 baked ham 37, corn 35
1 can pineapple 25 sent 32 to Eatons, balance 57

21 Fine day, a shower in afternoon Mrs Penning and Maggie spent the evening with us 12

22 Boys went to Cornwall, A. M. Donald milked the cows. A storm of thunder & lightning and rain in evening, and two fine rainbows
70 2 loaves 12

23 I was in church for the first time since off 25
off 25

24 Rain 70 paint for kitchen doors and wainscot 70 70
70 wast beef at Lancaster 1.24

25 Wrote to Eatons about curtain poles High wind, Showery all day
