Lovely fine day Miss Watts and sister went home with their father to-day, I assisted in getting them off, engaged with Joe Lane as the seamaker for next season spent the remainder of the day calling on the fathers and my friends before going away, also carried the mail to some of them had tea at Mr Hardings and after tea I went over to bid Mr Wadoo good bye, returning to Mr Hardings for the night very cold to night and windy Very cold Thursday after about 16° below zero. after breakfast. I bid Harding good bye and went up to Mrs Howes got ready for my departure

very soon Joe Lane came along and he threw in my trunk, and Mrs Howes helped me on with my coats and lent me ~~her~~ a muffler to wear I bid her good bye and studied the same with Gods blessing she was very sorry to see me go away, arriving at Knijohn I took the 1¹⁵ train for East on arriving in York the train for Round Bay was about 1³⁰ late so I went down in the village for a while and met J. Warner who is now living there returning to the Station in time for the train for East arriving about 5 o'clock all seemed pleased to see me again at the Methodist Churches here to night
