We left him in the yard with Nully which we tied the calf in the wagon box, we thought Nully would follow the calf and the steers go with her and Dad lead the team we got as far as the road when the calf got loose and while we were trying to get the steers got back in the box and jumped to the field with the rest. After a lot of chasing we got him out as far as the road again. when Dread-naught in some way twisted the snap on the steers out of his nose and got loose and led the steers ran up into the wheat. Enah came out with a gun. However we got them in and at last got well stacked. They ran into Matt's but Art Swanberg came down from there with us. Dad, Frank & Bert came right home when they were unloaded. Frank drove the lumber wagon with the

calf in it down so they came around home by Aunt's and got Mrs. Buckwells sofa which they bought and brought it home. I went up town and got the money and left it in the bank. This afternoon Frank and I took a ride to the mill and got a walnut table up at Mrs. McRae we got Jack Martin's sleds and took them over to the colony house which I want to move up as soon as possible. Dad & I then cleaned up some wheat to pay Sam Lee back and also some oats for Art Swanberg which Frank shot the gunnison bees. Frank and I took the wheat back about dark. It has been a nice day but a cold wind.

Sunday November 14th.

Frank rode his wheel down to Church this morning and Dick, Enah & I drove down. Aunt Alice came over with us to dinner. This afternoon Mary & I went for a walk up the Radical Road and got full of burrs. I went down to Aunt's for tea and went up with Aunt & Aunt Ida to church. Dick & I got home together about half past ten. The Nixons will hire this afternoon and left the number of the same. Dad had to go over to Frank Simon's to see a horse and didn't get back till dark.
