- 21. Bought at J. A's 4 1/2 lb cheese 58 cts. rained all day very little grain put in today. S. Campbell bundle for North West
- 22. Rained all forenoon. I went in afternoon to see Peggy, and at 2. to 4. I went for first we called at S. Campbell's. returned from Miss M Gunn's bundle for N. W. Donald Rags bundle for N. W. Auntie jacket for N. W.
- 24. The bale of clothing for the North west was packed this evening valued \$57. Bidie was to Lancaster and had a tooth drew. ^{Summer} Jennie M Gunnin took dinner with us. Yesterday got 3 loaves 18 cts. got from Sandy M. Gulyre 8 cts of beef got 3 1/2 lb steak 45 cts
- 25. Pa, Bidie & myself were at an excursion on the Bohemian. 50 cts each and dinner 25 cts. Pa took tea on the boat - 25. Bidie got nuts 20
- 26. Fair was done and went off again
- 29. We got a lot to suit on of milk Sandy's girls
- 30. It was Mary Stearns & baby that Jimmie met
