 got a Munk in the shanty to Day 31st
 E Wind Fine Gordon here gave him a Comforter
 1st of February W Wind Frosty Fine Edward Dug
 Jim Burns Barnhart and 3 Indians came to cut
 the Manure as its froze very hard about 1 1/2 Feet
 thick 2nd First Teams Came to Draw I Nicholson
 and 2 Douquets Stephen Gyo Burns 1 Indian
 Barnhart made 11 Loads to Day Fine Christmas
 Day the Sun shines to Day the Bear if he
 comes out will see his shadow 3rd Jim Nicholson
 and Jo and Edward with Teams Made 12 Loads
 Day 4th Cold in the Morning Stephen Gyo came
 and as no one was coming he went off met
 ellan up on our Road took the wrong Road
 he was going to Salmon River I roped
 see what was wrong with them not
 mung it was the cold Bought of Nicholson
 6 lb of Tea 45 cents paid Bought of Mr Ward pipe 1st
 one Thrashing at H. Amittou 5th very very
 frosty to Day Tom Jack came Brought me
 Bags of Grain 1⁰⁰ of Flour paid this commenced to load
 made 4 trips to Day John Nicholson 2 trips
 recor or m^o Pheel 2 trips to Day very very cold
 and Tom Jack 4 trips to Day that's 8 Load to Day
 Tom Jack took 6 Loads Nicholson 5 peccor 5th
 ed 4 Jo 3 of Kershaw here to help that's
 3 Loads to Day turned warmer E Wind
 fine Warm
